Breed Heritage Report

Work has continued with positivity on many families throughout the UK where the Breed Heritage committee have suggested matings on females within three categories. Those who excel in milk yields, those that excel in component transmit ability, along with families showing consistency.

The aim is to suggest sires to compliment these traits to the next generation, considering the sires predicting the highest yields, those who transmit highest components and then sires to improve the index on the consistent breeders.

The Breed Heritage Manager keeps the records of all females on the program, and updates information as it is suggested to, and received from breeders. He also provides the committee with updates on the data, provides a sire list to enable the committee easy access to available sires, and implements any research required and projects set by the committee.

A new sire list is created after each proof run, containing both proven and genomic young sires from the AHDB available bull lists, including those sires with minimum standards set by the committee. Each sire is ranked on its merits and is provided as a visual aid to compare against each individual sire. Bulls must be a minimum of 87.5% Ayrshire, be positive on PLI, be free from the AM mutation and have any haplotypes identified.

The program is in place to work with breeders to assist in breed improvement and to fulfil our charitable requirement to protect the Ayrshire breed heritage whilst building the pedigree to the point that they can possibly be bull mothers of the future. When a female is suggested for the programme the committee consider its breeding, its production potential and past records. Females do not enter the program if they lose more than three months in time in their first three lactations (unless we have a proven reason for any loss in time which is accepted by the committee). Another red flag will be its Production Index, but obviously only where this figure can be relevant.

Daughters born this year to Breed Heritage matings have confirmed the great work this program is achieving. Here are a few examples:

Cuthill Towers Majestic Blossom produced twin heifers by Plein Soleil Hacker and have huge predictions on yield (1026kgs) and index (PLI 325), whilst raising the breed percentage.

Swaites Dilly 19 produced a heifer by Palmyra Lochinvar Reynolds, continuing with the impressive milk predictions (693 kgs) and raising breed percentage.

Fineview Rockstar Ivy gave birth to a Plein Soleil Hunter heifer which has again a great Index (PLI 323) with high production (421 kgs) and high component predictions (21.2kg fat, 18.9kg ptn).

Cottown Feton Emma produced a heifer by Haresfoot Panache to excel further the components value up to 0.16% bfat and 0.04% ptn whilst holding good yields (222 kgs) and high index (PLI 284).

Committee members will often suggest new families to work with or breeders themselves ask us to consider females in their herds who may benefit from being a part of this program. Several new families have recently been added, and some examples of these follow:

Bowden Spicey Hex. She is a Biddesden Hector daughter out of an EX93 Rosehill Manderville X EX93 Woodland View Pardner X VG89 Bankend Photo Finish. Fertility has been consistently good and production Index always positive, (meaning outperforming herd mates on production). Spicey Hex herself has an impressive PI from her first lactation and is also producing high components.

Wroughton Mayflower 2. She is a Wroughton Lord Winston daughter from an EX92 Haresfoot Panache X VG88 Palmyra Tri Star Reality X VG88 McCornick Navigator X EX93 Horizon Ranger. Again, fertility is good, and production has been impressive, with consistency in type from a solid cow family.

Swaites Bright Spark 11. A VG87 2yr old daughter of Troutbeck Progress X VG86 Rosehill Vitality X EX94 Brieryside Red Centurian X EX92 Swaites Duport. Production throughout this family is huge and fertility can also only be described as impressive! And she has the looks! We will work with the breeder to encourage higher percentage of Ayrshire blood and suggest sires to continue the mentioned impressive traits.

Alongside the existing Breed Heritage programme which identifies and works with cow families, steering them in the direction to be bull mothers and enhancing the purity of the breed, the committee have pushed forward to implement the **"Genetic expansion project"**. The main aim of this project is to identify current on farm young bulls for potential on farm conventional semen collection. This has to be prioritised on the mainland as any semen collection for commercial distribution in Northern Ireland must be collected in approved facilities. The criterion for selection is simple:

1. Pure bloodlines only 93.75% - 100%
2. Proven and respected cow family
3. Dam should ideally outperform herd mates on production
4. Fertility of Dam under BH requirements
5. Be of an outcross as much as possible

Once a bull is selected and agreed by the committee an application for relevant licences and an appointment of an approved service provider will be implemented. Only one jump will be required where anything up to 600 doses may be collected. We are aware it could be considerably less and will work with the results accordingly. Breed Heritage will use some of the product produced for future work on the program and the remainder will be offered for sale to

interested breeders, with an allocation to be retained by the breeder of the bull. Assistance from Sam Wake at Cattle Services has been agreed to help us with the licence applications, storage, and delivery of the product.

We see this as a project which must be prioritised for the future of the UK Ayrshire Breed and are aware that only small amounts of conventional semen are used but would hope to get breeders support by adding some alternative bloodlines to their breeding program.

We are delighted to have now identified two potential young bulls, and so we will commence to implement this project. Details will be announced as and when a final decision is made, and the bulls have passed the relevant tests and are ready for collection to begin.

World Conference Reflection

It was a great honour for the Society to welcome over 100 delegates from nine different countries for the World Ayrshire Conference in June.

Planning for this event started in what feels like a lifetime ago, in Australia in January 2020, where we secured the bid to host the 2024 Conference. But where do you start planning an event like this?

After many meetings, ideas and discussions, the dates were confirmed, the route was planned and most importantly, the hotels were secured to welcome delegates to London.



SUNDAY 30th JUNE – A busy day was had by our wonderful bus carriers, Linda Batty and Jennifer Adams for the blue bus and Jane Barnes for the orange bus, along with Sarah Liddell and Amy Sayer, welcoming delegates to a sunny London at The Tower Hotel before we set sail with a relaxing cruise up the River Thames.



From London, we headed west, taking a trip through Windsor where Adrian Tomlinson, the late Queens former herdsman joined to give us a guided tour of town, before we moved onto our first herd visit of the tour, **BIDDESSEN** (above). We were welcomed by Catriona and family, where delegates were invited to view the herd at their leisure before continuing the journey to Exeter with a brief detour to view Stonehenge (top-right) before reaching our destination.



Thankfully, the weather was on our side for day three of the tour as we headed further into the southwest. Our first stop was to Courtney Walters and family's **LYNER** herd. The cows were a real picture in the field with beautiful scenery surround them. We enjoyed some traditional Cornish pasties and scones, the Cornish way... which way would you have your jam and clotted cream? All aboard the bus and bound for **ROSEHILL** Ayrshires. The narrow roads amazed many people as we got closer to the farm with a few hairy moments for the bus drivers as the verges were only millimeters from the side of the busses. A very warm welcome was received from the Christophers family where we spent the afternoon before enjoying an evening of delicious food, drink and plenty cow chatter!

From the southwest, we started to head north for a few nights in Cheltenham stopping to view Mike Windel's **WROUGHTON** herd (below) on the way. Mike's passion for the Ayrshire cow was clear to see throughout the herd and was a privilege for us to walk through.





Day five took us to HRH The King's former herd, **DUCHY** (above). The herd was purchased from HRH three years ago by Henry-James Gay. Grazing on a low input, organic system, Henry-James' aim is to increase yield using genetics. Following the Duchy herd visit, delegates were taken to Highgrove for a private tour of the stunning gardens that His Majesty has spent 40 years perfecting. We unfortunately cannot share photos of this part of the tour due to a restriction on photography, however we would strongly recommend visiting if you were ever in the area.

The next few days were busy, covering many miles whilst still heading north, through the midlands. Friday began with a visit to the **HUNNINGTON** herd (below). We received a very warm welcome from Lisa Window and her family before being invited into the field to see the herd. We enjoyed a hog roast lunch before heading onto Cogent's Bull Stud. This was a very interesting visit viewing some of the current sires on centre as well as the lab where the semen is sorted and sexed.



ITS PARTY TIME! Friday finished with a visit to the **BEELINE** herd where after seeing the cows, the party began! Lots of food, laughter, dancing, and the odd drink or two... The busses then departed for Buxton, fuelled with "refreshments" for the journey!

During the time in Buxton, the delegates had some optional visits. One group took a day off from cows to view Chatsworth House and Gardens whilst the other group departed for the first stop of the day to **HEYDALE** Ayrshires by permission of Peter Berresford and family. We enjoyed not only looking at the cows, but also the miles of Derbyshire Dales (top-right).

We then moved onto view the **BIGGINVALE** herd whilst enjoying a very tasty lunch with their own Belted Galloway Organic Beef, bred and reared by the Adams family..



Day eight allowed delegates to enjoy a lazy morning before heading just down the road to see the **WHITECROFT** herd (below) and meet the Broadley family. After some slightly damp weather, some afternoon entertainment soon got some very healthy competition running in the form of Pig Racing! The evening was hosted by David and Charlotte Gibson at their Beltonville Cow Shed Cafe.



The tour then continued to Chris and Andrea Adams's **TESSVALE** herd where the weather was on our side to show the herd to their best and a very exciting and interesting tour of the JCB factory.



We then moved onto Yorkshire which was home for the next few days while we attended the Great Yorkshire Show and hosted the World Ayrshire Federation Conference meetings which are both reported separately in this journal.

We finally crossed the border on day 13, bound for Edinburgh after a long day of traveling with a few stops along the way at Wheelbirks farm shop and Morwick Ice Cream parlour.

World Federation of Ayrshire Breed Societies Report

A Directors meeting took place at the recent World Conference. Several topics and future developments were discussed and adopted.

The World photographic competition was seen as a huge success. The Photographic platform reached a total of 1,016,965 people in 10 Facebook posts. The largest was 308,779 reaches for the milking 5yr Olds. A new class is to be added to the 2024 competition. This will be an "Amateur" photograph of an individual female of any age.

An application to become a member of the World Federation of Ayrshire Breed Societies was received from an organisation known as Anaaygu from Italy. The Board of Directors unanimously accepted their application and stated that they are delighted to welcome Anaaygu as a new member of the World Federation of Ayrshire Breed Societies.

Michel Boudreault reported to inform the Board of Directors of the Genetic Data Exchange project's position. Since its formation at the end of 2022, most member countries have all facilitated the transmission of data, which was required.

Negotiations continue to attempt to access further data.

The World Federation of Ayrshire Breed Societies is providing a grant for "Ayrshire Breed Promotion" within country, which will be funded by the WAF Investment profits. A maximum of £2000 GBP will be made available per annum, which may be split between applicants or allocated as a whole, for a grant which must be applied for.

A youth tour for 2025/26 is being considered but nothing yet confirmed. Any updates will be communicated as soon as an offer of a host is confirmed.

The new President is Robert Albertsson from Sweden. Vince Steiner from New Zealand is now Vice President, with Edmund Els from South Africa and Eleanor Robinson representing Canada as Executive Directors. Duncan Hunter from the UK is the Executive Secretary for the next term.

The next World Conference will be held in 2028 in Sweden.

Frank Lea Dodd

ELLERTON AND EYTON AYRSHIRES



Renowned cattle breeder and former President of the Ayrshire Cattle Society, Frank Dodd passed away peacefully after a short illness on 25th January with the family at his side. He was 96 years old.

Frank grew up at Ellerton Grange, near Newport, Shropshire, where he worked alongside his brother Peter and father George, developing the Ellerton herd of pedigree Ayrshire cattle. The herd was founded in the early 1930's by George and was established using heifers from strong cow families in Mr Will Slater's Eyton, Hadley and Sheriffhales herds. These cattle were bred to bulls purchased on a regular basis from Scotland, in particular, the Bargower herd. The herd achieved considerable success, winning many prizes all around the UK including the Royal show championship in 1976 & 77 and Breed champion at the Dairy Event in 1970, 72, 79 & 80. In 1974 the Ellerton herd achieved the ultimate accolade by winning the BOCM Silcock Gold trophy for the Best herd in Great Britain in all breeds.

Frank was also a director of WH Slater farms, the farming business founded by his uncle, Will Slater at Sheriffhales Manor, near Shifnal. WH Slater farms was a very large business in 40's and 50's comprising 3 milking herds of Ayrshires. These cattle were at the very top of the breed. In 1949 the show team won virtually every prize at the London Dairy show including Supreme Champion. The following year, the draft sale was attended by over 2500 people and world record prices were achieved.

Following Mr Slater's premature death, in 1962 Frank took on the running of the business with his Aunt Elizabeth and oversaw the dispersal sale of the

Hadley and Eyton herds when the tenancies of these farms was surrendered. The Sheriffhales herd was retained but continued under the Eyton prefix which was the first prefix that Mr Slater registered. The herd was housed in magnificent white tiled cow sheds decked out with hanging baskets of flowers.

The 'new' Eyton herd also achieved considerable success including the Inter breed Championship of the Royal show in 1973 and the Dairy event on three occasions.

The Ellerton and Eyton herds worked closely together and continued holding bi-annual draft sales of heifers and young bulls alternately at the two farms up to the late 80's. These sales drew large crowds every year from across the UK and abroad. In 1994 Frank purchased Upper Woodhead Apricot at the conference sale for a record price of 10,000gns from the Morrell family. Apricot went to win the Dairy event in 1994 and was reserve champion at the Royal and Dairy event in 1997. She bred 3 bulls that went into AI.

Frank was a highly respected judge of dairy cattle and was in demand as a judge at shows around the country and overseas. He served on the Ayrshire cattle society council and in 1976 had the honour of being elected President.

A strong believer in farmer cooperation, he was Vice chairman of Wrekin farmers for 25 years. He was also on the council of Royal Association of British Dairy farmers. He supported his local agricultural show at Newport throughout his life and was President in 1977.

Away from farming, Frank was a circuit steward of his local Methodist chapel at Soudley and regularly attended St Mary's church in Sheriffhales as well. He enjoyed game shooting and watching sport particularly cricket.

Frank had four daughters with his first wife, Jean who died tragically in 1962. He later married Heather who had also been sadly widowed with two young sons. John and Andrew both joined the business and continue to farm at Ellerton Grange and Attwell park.

After retirement Heather and Frank moved to Park View in Sheriffhales where he played a big part in the village community, serving on the parish council and village hall committees for many years. They were keen gardeners and were kept busy looking after their large garden and enjoying frequent visits from their 17 grandchildren. Frank and Heather were happily married for 59 years. He will be sorely missed.

When reduction or dispersal sales are planned, pedigree stock will always bring higher value sales, with those animals having superior ancestry and production records often traded at huge values and averages. Government compensation paid out for losses at times of disease and infections in the national herd, have and always will be at a significantly higher rate for pedigree animals over those that are non-pedigree.

Pedigree registration also allows access to vital genetic information on each animal including production traits and (PLI) Profitable Lifetime Index, along with full traceability on its ancestry. Registered Ayrshires also have access to type classification and genomic testing which all help to genetically improve your herd. All registered animals full details of ancestry, production and type can be viewed on the ACS website through the NBDC animal search system and their genetic credentials are immediately updated after each proof run. This information enables informed decisions to be made for breeding the next generation to capitalise on maximum genetic gain.

The value of pedigree easily outweighs the cost of a registration for an Ayrshire which makes registering very cost effective to your business. Animals should be registered under 3 months old to be cost effective whilst helping the cash flow of a business. Applying for older registrations in larger numbers will bring penalty costs and generally dents a business cash flow.

We all know that every livestock breeder must apply for a passport soon after an animal is born, so to maximise efficiency of finance and time to your business the obvious action is to use the facility which is provided for passports and breed pedigree registrations to be applied for at the same time, through Telereg and Webreg. 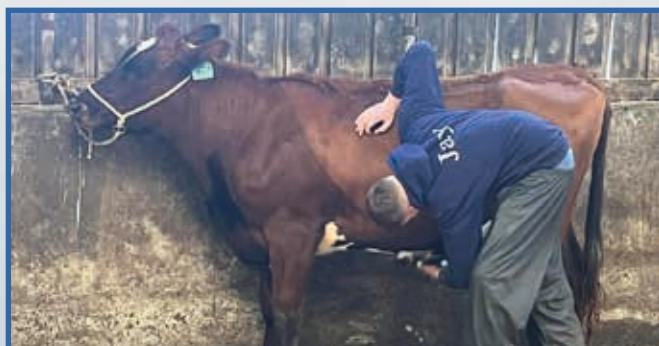
This event is held annually, where Ayrshire Young Breeders get together to learn, compete and socialise with each other. The competitions are focused on the Hugh Stevenson award and the John Cochrane trophy, for the highest placed individuals throughout all the competitions.

Day one commenced with a bus ride North to Kirk Andreas to Balleigh Farm, home to the Callow family for the first competition which was Stock Judging. Judge, Duncan Hunter gave a demonstration to the young breeders explaining the desirable and undesirable traits of a dairy cow. Two great classes of Ayrshires were presented for judging where

the competitors placed and gave reasons on their observations. The standard shown from these young people was incredibly impressive, especially how they demonstrated positivity and accuracy in their reasons. Following a quick walk through the herd, we were treated to a wonderful pub lunch with many of the local breeders attending.

We then headed East of the Island to Ballabeg, home to the Ronague herd belonging to the Masson family. This visit was focused on the Sire Selection competition, where competitors evaluate two cows put forward, and then suggest a sire mating for each cow from a list of sires provided and give a written explanation of their choices. Again, we had superb hospitality provided and it was wonderful to be joined by some of our invaluable sponsors. Judge Duncan Hunter and AYB leader Jake Sayer were especially impressed with the detail thought that the competitors demonstrated in this section.





On day two we travelled to Ballalough, West Baldwin, to the Sandersfarms herd owned by the Sanders family for the clipping and showmanship competitions. Competitors were allocated their calves and then proceeded to the commencement of the clipping. Our judge for the day was Michael Kinvig, who closely observed the proceedings. Some animals were a little livelier than others, but the competitors soldiered on, clipped, washed and presented their animals for the judge to inspect.

In the afternoon, competitors were all eagerly prepared for the showmanship competition. Michael Kinvig was again officiating and put the competitors through their paces, with some very close placings. The champion handler was Meg Stratton with Alec Masson in Reserve.

All the competitors were very grateful for the feedback from both judges over the two days which

will help them develop further for the YB event next year, which is to be held in Southeast England.

Success in showcasing Ayrshires in the Southwest

Les Rockett founded and manages the Greenway herd of Ayrshires. Following so much success in the showing during recent years, we are delighted to feature that success and the enthusiasm from Les, Tracy and Abi.

Ebsworthy Moor is situated close to the village of Bridestowe, a historic village near the Dartmoor National Park in the district of West Devon. This is home to Les Rockett and his wife Tracy along with Tracys daughter Abi Marshall. The family are well known for their dedication and enthusiasm to showing their Ayrshires and indeed other breeds throughout the Southwest of England.

Les was born into farming originally from Wambrook Chard, Somerset. His father left the family farm but continued farming for several years in Leighton Buzzard, Bedfordshire, before moving to Devon, first to St Giles, and then on to North Tawton, where they were milking 60 Guernsey's. In the early 1980s, following a family separation, Les purchased Ebsworthy Moor as a green field site, with only 10 in calf Guernsey heifers to his name. Building an infrastructure was prioritised before purchasing some pedigree British Friesians and some cross breeds.

Following the foot and mouth outbreak in 2001, Les purchased the Galmpton British Friesian herd close to the Greenway Estate, which is when he decided to introduce "Greenway" as his pedigree prefix. His late wife, June, had persuaded him to go out to purchase

some Ayrshires. Eastacombe Bracken, Josephine and Ellie along with Meikles Belinda 6 were sourced and were to be the foundation to the Greenway herd of Ayrshires. Sadly, June passed away in 2010. Sometime later he met Tracy and Abi, to form the relationship as it is today!

Currently 150 acres are farmed at Ebsworthy Moor milking 70 head of mixed breeds but are predominantly Ayrshires and Holsteins. Grazing is prioritised and simple winter rations are fed. Les continues to do most day-to-day chores at the youthful age of 69 including most of the field work but will call on a local contractor when required. Tracy feeds the calves, assists with milking and is responsible for the farms books! Abi works away from home but continues to help when she can, and she does all the preparation for showing.

Showing is a passion for the whole family. Over recent years they have shown at North Somerset, Devon County, Royal Bath and West, Royal Cornwall, Southwest Dairy Show, Okehampton, Liskeard, North Devon, Exeter calf show and the ABAB calf show with much success.

During the last three years a huge amount of success has seen 5 Interbreed Dairy Champions, 3 Reserve Interbreeds, 14 breed Championships, 4 Reserve Breed Champions and 2 Interbreed pairs champions. These results were won with seven different animals! These included:

Whilst talking of favourites, its only right to hear of those special ones from Tracy and Abi. **Greenway Sweetheart EX92(2)** was the reason Tracy fell in love with Ayrshires and led her to much success. Regarded as a favourite for Tracy as Sweetheart was her first show cow. For Abi, it was her first major success in the showring when she won Interbreed Champion at Exeter calf show in 2016 with **Greenway Redrock EX93(3)**. 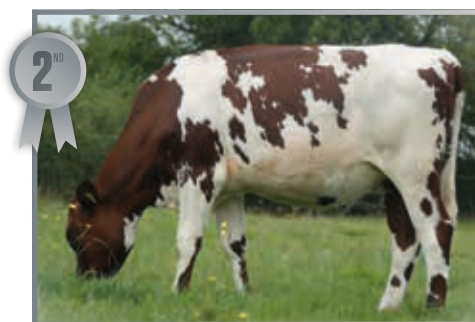

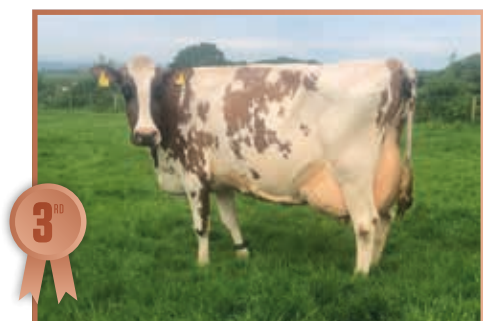

Judge Jess Miller: "The cow in first is quite an easy placing, she has such a beautiful frame, a balance of dairyness and strength that is so hard to master! That udder is such a great texture and so well attached, she has the advantage over the second-place cow for simply being so much more cow and I just prefer the structure of the rump on this superb, aged cow in first place. Second over third for me was quite a close placing but I went for the cow that showed me a little more style through the front end and a bit more balanced throughout, she took the advantage through her depth of heart and her udder being that bit more youthful for me. Overall, a tremendous class of cows, really showing off just what the breed has to offer but topped off with that exceptional cow that rivals the best in the world."

Judge Jess Miller: "The first-place heifer shows so much style that beautiful dairy front end, open rib and great legs, she took the advantage over this very similar cut heifer in second just for that little bit more femininity and finer through the hock, she's that little bit cleaner through the thigh, following up in third with this really stretchy heifer, with that strong top and looks so well grown. Overall, a very strong class but very difficult to judge heifers and dry cows together, the youth came out on top on this occasion!"

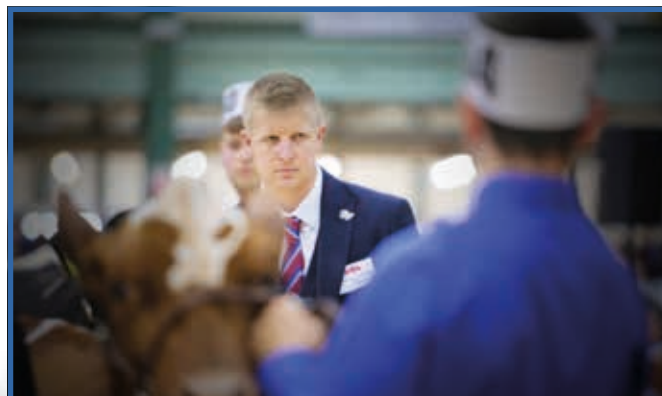

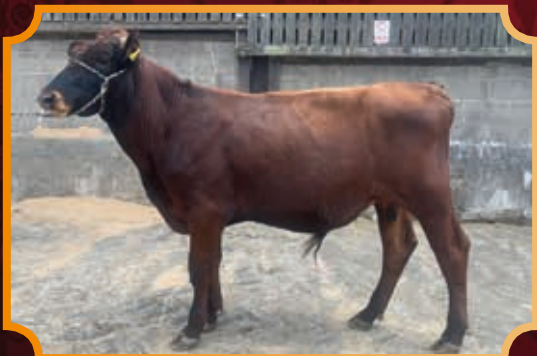

Unfortunately, Cattle Services continues to battle against a number of health challenges including following the strict health tests to get a bull onto stud. Only recently, another hurdle has cropped up which is blue tongue. This has restricted where we can source our bulls from as some parts of the country are now completely closed off which hampers our selection process.

Another continuous problem we face is TB, as farms need to be TB free for two years before a bull can be considered. As well as the potential bull needing a clear test before moving, if his dam is still on the farm, she also must test clear. If not, cohorts to the dam are tested.

UK DAIRY DAY

The National Ayrshire Show was once again held at UK Dairy Day in September where it was Ian Collins from the well-known Churchcroyd Shorthorn herd taking centre of the ring.

Despite the challenges of disease restrictions across the east coast of the UK, breeders from many other parts of the country were welcomed to Telford to showcase the Ayrshire breed.

The first class of the day was the junior milking heifer class. Ian led the class with **Hunnington Naomi 8**, a Blackadder BB Kellogg daughter from L & C Window, also awarding her **best udder and exhibitor bred**. It was her width through her front end and overall length and frame that gave her the advantage over the second placed heifer, **Paith Hawaiian Eclipse 2**, exhibited by Iwan Thomas.

Senior milking heifer's followed where **Bigginvale Buttermilk 130** from RT & JI Adams, a daughter of a homebred stock bull, **Bigginvale Chopan** took first in the class along with best udder and exhibitor bred. It was the bloom in her mammary system, the hardness over her top and overall balance on parade over **Rhos Lottery Lesley** from Adam Montgomerie in second place.

Bigginvale Buttermilk 130 then went on to take heifer champion with **Hunnington Naomi 8** in reserve and **Paith Hawaiian Eclipse 2** with honourable mention.

Moving onto the cow classes, **Swaites Lois 8**, a Whitcroft Nectar daughter from John Adamson caught the eye of Ian on parade, taking first place, **best udder and exhibitor bred**. He highlighted her cleanliness, femininity and beautiful bone quality, it was her outstanding mammary system that gave her the advantage over **Morwick Peggy 126** from R Baynes and S Mullan in second.

The standard continued through into the intermediate cows where Ian had no hesitation on leading the class with **Mid Ascog Patricia 3** from the Firm of D M Lindow, a cow with tremendous length with great overall capacity in both her body and udder that gave her the advantage over **Brieryside Magic Patsy** from Jake and Amy Sayer in second.

The final class of the day welcomed three, powerful senior cows to the ring. It was show veteran, **Hunnington Wren 7** that took **first in the class** along with **best udder and exhibitor bred**. Ian highlighted how tremendous she looked for having had seven calves. The height and width to her rear

udder along with spring of rib, and rump structure gave her the success over another strong, deep cow, **Harperfield Queen of the South 60** from DM Lindsay in second.

Before the championship, the **exhibitors' group of three** brought four groups to the ring. Taking the top of the class, and recipients of the **Gordon Timbrell Memorial Trophy** was DM Lindsay, with L&C Window in close second.

The pinnacle of the day is always the championship and with a lineup of eight tremendous heifers and cows, it was anyone's guess where the judge would go. Ian went forward, and crowned **Swaites Lois 8** as his overall champion, with **Mid Ascog Patricia 3** in reserve followed by **Hunnington Wren 7** in honourable mention.

ACS JUDGING SEMINAR MARLEYCOTE



A judging seminar was recently held at Marleycote Walls, Slaley, Northumberland, home of the Baynes family. Many competitors and visitors witnessed an impeccably presented display of quality high yielding Ayrshire heifers. Some breeders travelled from as far as Stranraer and Derbyshire and it was also a pleasure to welcome our friends from Sweden, breeders Klas Johansson and Anja Dalhog.

The event began with a brief presentation by Duncan Hunter on the requirement for judges to consider breed characteristics and the correctness of functional traits whilst judging and an explanation of certain trait measurements which can sometimes cause confusion.

Two classes of six milky heifers were presented by Richard Baynes and his huge team of helpers for the official event where judges placed both classes in their preferred order and gave reasons on one of the classes.



At the March 24 Council meeting the ACS Council made the decision to reimplement the consensus scoring system with Duncan

Hunter being responsible for the reason giving scoring, to bring more consistency to these events. The consensus results were announced and some very positive discussions on the results took place, before Richard informed the visitors of the cow family, sire and production of each animal.

A third class of six heifers were presented for a separate sweepstake competition, judged by local breeder Paul Harrison. The only person who came away financially better off than they were when they arrived, and winner of the sweepstake was Matthew Service.

We were delighted with the standard from the judges attending and they must be commended on their attitude, positivity and professionalism. Thirteen judges scored over 80% with eight of those excelling at over 90%, and a further two reaching the qualifying score of 75%.

Following a delicious lunch, visitors were invited to a walk around this very impressive herd of cows and an equally admirable dairy farming system.

The work that Richard Baynes, his family and his helpers contributed to the event was evident which made the day so successful, and this was all very much appreciated by everyone. We extend our sincere thanks and appreciation to them all for their hard work, enthusiasm and dedication to the day.
