

Martin and Jane Parkes, along with their daughter Jenny run the Highway herd of pedigree Ayrshires at Keyses Farm in Castlemorton, near Malvern in Worcestershire. Here we find out a little more about the herd and their farming practises.

How long has the Highway herd been established and where does the Highway Prefix come from?

The herd was established by my parents, Tom, and Peggy in 1951 at Upper Cottage Farm, Bromsgrove. The farm was bordered by the Alvechurch Highway, which is

the Alvechurch Highway which is where the prefix was derived from. We moved to Keyses Farm in 1976.

How many are currently milking and how many followers at Keyses Farm?

71 milking cows and heifers with 40 followers and about 30 store cattle.

What type of system do you operate?

140 acres of clay, lying wet land, mostly grass with 20 – 30 acres of Maize is grown. A low input system with all year-round calving suits the farm and the business income. The cows are out as long as possible,

generally March to November where strip grazing is largely practised. During the winter cows are fed grass and maize silage and purchased fodder beet along with roughly 1000kgs of concentrates per cow. The cows are milked in a 6 abreast milking system and are mostly bred to pure Ayrshire bloodlines with some easy calving beef used on some cows and heifers.


Which cow families have consistently excelled within the Highway herd?

The Brown Fairy and Lorna families show the most consistency. Both

families demonstrate longevity, production, and type. The Brown Fairy lines trace as far back as 1912 and have continued to this day to hold true pure bloodlines.

Which sires over the years have made the biggest impact in the Highway herd?

Brocklehill Happy Spirit, Mark Samsson and Twemlow Admiral Glen. But the biggest influence has come from the homebred

Highway Hallmark (Caldervale Lord James x Highway Mona 6 EX) who was used extensively during the foot-and-mouth outbreak. 18 daughters were scored EX/VG and all milking progenies were above average production.

An interview with Martin

Parkes, Highway Ayrshires

If you had the opportunity to use a bull from any cow family in the UK, which family would that be and why?

Blackrock Flo and Lyner Fairystory are both families which exhibit depth and spring of rib with great udders which are traits we look for at Highway.

Which sires are currently being used in the Highway herd?

Ardmore Crown Napier, Ravenhill Victory, Plum Bottom Tridents Lot, Plaskett Bruno, and Highway Lysander (Hector x Highway Diamond Brown Fairy 60 EX94 5E)

Which traits - type, health, and production, do you feel are most important to your business and why?

Good legs and feet are paramount, and we are proud to maintain this trait well. We breed for strong robust cows with good longevity and temperament. Production wise, cows with

> a natural will to milk with high butterfat content is always prioritised for our Muller milk contract whilst observing £PLI for health traits.

> As a breeder of Ayrshires, how has the breed helped you and your business over the years?

A healthy herd of medium sized cows suits the system at Keyses Farm, and we have had very few issues with foot problems and very few calving issues over the years. This in turn has led us to very low vet costs. The longevity of the breed has allowed the sale of surplus cattle to our regular buyers.

Do you see a particular value of breeding pedigree animals and classifying your cows and heifers, if so, why?

There is no denying the value that pedigree breeding brings which creates a great interest and of course valuable information for cow families and combined with classifications creates evaluations for future sire use within our herd.

As a member of the Ayrshire Cattle Society, what have you gained from being a member?

The pedigree system provides us with easy

access to valuable information about our female and male lines. The Ayrshire Journal keeps us up to date with what is going on in other herds. In addition, meeting other like-minded breeders and attending AGM Conference visits in different areas of the country has always been worthwhile and a welcome break. How else would we have ever witnessed Jesse Bostock playing the drums in Cornwall!



LOOKING BACK Young Breeders, Norfolk 1995 Norfolk the venue for Ayrshire young members' annual meet

The sixth Ayrshire Cattle Society Young Breeders Gathering was held in Norfolk this year and a total of 40 delegates from all over the country attended the two-day event. Young members were invited to visit all six registered Ayrshire herds in the area and take part in stock judging and other competitions.

H ugh and Jenny Gilmour's Buckenham herd has had a string of successes over the years: their Ayrshires had the highest average PIN over all breeds in Norfolk for the 1992/93 year, and the highest average PIN over all Ayrshire herds in England and Wales during 1992/93 and 1993/94. They also took the NMR Norfolk Ayrshire Breeders Cup in these same years.

Based at Park Farm, Old Buckenham, near Norwich, the herd provided young members the chance to guess the sires of six top cows.

The Gilmours' connection with the

he master judge for both days was Harry Barton (pictured right) from Bilsborrow, near Preston, who runs the 120-strong Myerscough herd whose average yield stands at 6,250kg.

"A gathering such as this is vital for the young breeders and the Ayrshire breed – they are the future of the breed," he says. It provides an opportunity for them to form their own opinions about the breed away from the influence of those back at home and Harry has already seen an improvement in the skills of the delegates during the event.

"They're all picking up good habits in areas such a showmanship and you can see the enthusiasm for the breed spreading among them – there's a team atmosphere."

On this, his fourth visit, 22-year-old Andrew Broadley, an Ayrshire breeder from Derbyshire agreed that the gatherings are essential if the breed is to expand: "These meetings are a chance to meet fellow members and have a good time, but they're also invaluable as a means to catch up with what is happening within the breed," he says. Andrew sees a bright future for the Ayrshire, he believes it is economical, reliable and extremely hardy. He milks 120 cows near Buxton and says the herd has to walk four miles each day to grazing land: "I doubt other breeds could cope with this," he adds.

An ideal way to get some hands-on experience is how Wendy Collins describes the gathering. "Everyone has the chance to get involved and no one is left out on a limb." This is the second year she has attended and she plans to return. "I thoroughly enjoyed myself and learned a lot at the same time," explains this





breed goes back to just before the First World War when Hugh's grandfather owned the Windhill herd of pedigree Ayrshires at Eaglesham in Renfrewshire.

In 1929 the family moved south and set up the South Cove herd in Suffolk, moving again in 1944 to their present location – the 70-cow herd is now in its 51st year.


TRADITION

Hugh admits that running an Ayrshire herd for him is very much part of a tradition: "My father and grandfather were very keen and their enthusiasm for the

21-year-old, who's father runs a mixed Shorthorn and Ayrshire herd at Dewsbury in West Yorkshire. "There's nowhere else to go for up-to-date information about the breed – the society's annual conference is for older members and I find it hard to relate to."

Wendy is certain that the Young Breeder's Gathering will help to ensure that Ayrshires will be around for many years to come. "The Society is working hard to promote these profitable cattle which have sound conformation, are stylish and pleasing to the eye," she says, listing longevity and good milk quality as some of their positive aspects. "There are many black and white breeders coming in and recognising these attributes – I think they've got a good future." Both Wendy and Andrew see themselves milking Ayrshire herds of their own in the future. breed has stayed with me," he says. Yields and margins for the herd are well above the national black and white average: at 7,132kg at 4.2% fat and 3.28% protein with an average PIN95 of +£19. The rolling margin over concentrate per cow to February 1995 stands at £1,185.

Hugh is breeding for larger cows with more capacity, but he doesn't want to lose the attributes of the Ayrshire. Semen from Round Bush Commander was used on the herd several years ago and was rated high on the young bull proving scheme. "We have five daughters by him and they're all very good cattle," says Hugh.

Ayrshire herd proves a sound choice for the Howe family

D udley and Jennifer Howe's Oldbreck Ayrshire herd was established in 1960 with just six heifers and the herd has now grown to 50 cows. But it was in 1936 that Dudley's father started dairy farming with a herd of Red Polls. In 1944 he bought an Ayrshire bull because Ayrshire cows had better teats for milking machines.

This was where delegates were asked to guess the lifetime yield of a cow, take part in a stock judging competition and choose their best cow in the herd.

Average yield stands at 6,038kg with 3.77% fat and 3.23% protein from many daughters of Brocklehill Happy Spirit with the milking heifers sired by Bankend Lord Ontario, Des Peupliers Rebel and Bonnie Brae Heligo.

DIFFICULTIES

Dudley aims to calve his heifers at two years because of the cost of keeping a heifer for an extra year and at three years old they tend to be over-fat, which gives them calving difficulties. "I'm not in for showing, just for milk production and it doesn't really matter if some end up on the smaller side," he explains. All heifers are inseminated with top-quality, bull semen to capitalise on genetic gain.

Dudley is sold on the breed: "I find it a pleasure to walk among my cattle," he says, adding that this helps him to spot health and fertility problems. "If you're not interested, how can you do your job properly?"

SUSCEPTIBLE

But Ayrshires aren't just aesthetically pleasing, stresses Dudley. "They have wonderful udders and as a breed they're less susceptible to mastitis," he says, "this winter, the herd has seen only six cases."

Ayrshires will also milk well on poorer quality feed and are better than other breeds at feed conversion, he says. "They're deep-bodied cows with large stomachs – other breeds just haven't got the capacity."

BREED HERITAGE REPORT

Duncan Hunter, Breed Heritage Programme Manager.

The committee continue to offer suggested mating's on many females selected from all over the United Kingdom. We have a full and up to date list of data which provides information on every animal on the programme, which includes service sires and due dates to be efficient and proactive. We also hold an up to date sire list showing data on production, type and health traits along with their back breeding to provide the committee with as much information as possible.

As a result of our request for breeders to nominate females who should be a part of the Breed Heritage programme, we are now working with a number of those breeders who submitted individuals to help to excel with the next generation of genetics. We are currently breeding for extremes, using high milk sires on the females with the highest projected yield transmit ability, including Tontine Astorwell, Palmyra Lochinvar Reynolds, Cuthill Towers Majestic and VR Tokyo. The same path for female component specialists is being followed and we naturally monitor health traits as best we can.

Breeder cooperation has been fantastic. There are some impressive females which were born in 2022 and the first part of 2023 because of suggestions from the Breed Heritage Committee, which are bull mother ready, and there are also plenty of exciting pregnancies in several herds where females born will automatically be added to the programme. Males born are and will be looked at by Cattle Services for future possibilities. As a result of Breed Heritage input, a 100% young Ayrshire bull is currently short listed as a future sire for the Cattle Services stud. The Genetic expansion project has commenced where we have identified sires on farm who we believe could expand the breeds genetic pool which have different blood lines to those that are mostly available within AI sires.

In Northern Ireland we have identified an on farm bull who already has an impressive daughter proof which can offer the breed some great positives. He is being used naturally and exclusively in one herd with some superb females of outcross bloodlines in the attempt to create some young bulls of future interest for the breeds development. Due to on farm collection rules in Northern Ireland, if the bull had been collected on farm, the semen would not be eligible for distribution, so working with the breeder with some great families is the best outcome for the situation.

Another outcross young bull from a great cow family has been identified and is currently being worked with on farm which will potentially allow Breed Heritage to use semen for future breeding projects. More information on this young bull will be released as soon as we have conformation of availability.

We hope that members will continue to work with us and inform us of any cow family or individuals we should consider for either of our working programmes.

CATTLE SERVICES NEWS

Cattle Services Sales & Marketing Manager, Sam Wake, keeps you up to speed with the genetic advancements made within Cattle Services



There is nothing better than going onto farm and seeing progeny of Cattle Services bulls. Lately, it has been fantastic to see both Pam Ayrs Hawaiian and Biddesden Hector's daughters

looking great when they have recently calved. Both bulls' daughters display great udders alongside dairy frames

and there have been many reports about their great temperaments too.

Another sire who now has daughters milking is Sandyford Time Lord; many breeders are saying that they are also very good, particularly their great ability to milk. It is also refreshing to see that he is performing well in Canada also as you will see from the picture.

At Cattle Services, the aim is to release 6 sires a year however this can be very challenging due to bulls failing tests. Currently, three new sires have been lined up for 2023: the first being Time Lord at Mapleburn Ayrshires, Canada Troutbeck Daring. He is an Ardmore

Crown Napier son of the great Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3 who is scored EX96 (6E) and is due with her 9th calf this year. Daring is available in SEXED ULTRA High Purity and conventional straws.

The other two bulls are both currently starting their tests; the first of these is Ravenhill Revolver, who is a Cuthill **Towers Majestic son of Cochranes Revolution Present** EX94 (2E) - behind Present are a further four cows who are scored Excellent. The other bull is Hilltown Yukon Delta who is a La Croisee Yukon son of Hilltown Violet 476 VG88 - Violet 476 is then followed by four dams who are scored Excellent.

We try to get bulls onto centre at as young an age as possible.

Below is a timeline of how we work:

1. Calf born: it is either registered with the Society or the breeder lets us know in the first week.

2. 1-3 weeks: a genomic test is done on both the calf and his dam.

3. 3 months: genomic test results received and a decision is made on the calf by looking at pedigree, dam's performance within the herd and its genomic linear.

> 4. 3-4 months: breeder is notified if Cattle Services are interested in the calf and then purchased or contracted.

> 5. 8 months old: health tests begin on calf, dam and possible cohorts within the herd.

6. 10 months: bull is moved onto stud and placed in quarantine.

7.11 months: more health tests and then moved onto the collection barns.

8. 11 -12 months: collection begins which usually starts with conventional

straws. Once these past health testing, sexed straws are then taken. All bulls have a target placed on them for how many straws are needed to be collected.

Bulls then remain on centre for different lengths of time which is all dependant on the uptake of the bull. Some are on for only 3 months whereas others may remain on centre for up to a year. Once the bull has reached his target, he will then have more tests so that all his straws can then qualify for export - this is usually 30 days after his last collection. After this, bulls are sent back to farm; in the past there has been lay off units where bulls have been sent, unfortunately these no longer are available. This means that it is near on impossible to get a bull back to centre once it has gone onto a farm as it is deemed as being dirty. This can be very frustrating as some bulls sell out quicker than

others and it can be very annoying if you would like to use the bull again only to find out that he is no longer available. Unfortunately, the financial costs and room on stud means bulls cannot be on stud for 2 years.

Showing season for 2023 began at the Dairy Expo in Carlisle and it was a great success for progeny of Cattle Services bulls with the Champion and Reserve cows being sired by our bulls. The Champion was Morwick Peggy 126 who is sired by Pam Ayrs Hawaiian - he has sired many show winning calves and is now siring daughters who are winning in the milking classes. Later this year, there will be conventional straws of this great bull available again. The Reserve Champion was Beeline Magic Meg 2 who is sired by Brieryside Magic. At the moment, both of these bulls don't have straws available, however you can use their sons: Plaskett Bruno and Beechmount Magic Mike who are readily available in SEXED ULTRA 4M and conventional straws.

To conclude, some positive news associated with our sales for 2022: they were at their highest for the past 7 years, including a rise in SEXED sales at home and also a significant increase in export sales.

So far in 2023, this trend has continued with SEXED straws selling well and export orders already confirmed for South Africa, America and New Zealand.

TROUTBECK BURDETTE JESS 3 EX96 (6E), LP80, SP – NOT JUST A PRETTY FACE.....

Not many cows in the world reach the elite status of scoring EX96, one of these is Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3 who was classified EX96 on 1st July 2020, her breakdown was EX97 for feet and legs and dairy capacity, EX96 for mammary, EX95 dairy character and EX93 for rump. had 9 services in her lifetime, she is due again with her 9th calf at 11 years of age on the 1st June to Halmyre Urr Lieutenant.

This year Jess has been on an extensive IVF program which has resulted in fertilised embryos sired by Harperfield Sands of Time, Brieryside Hail, Hunnington Fantasy and Mardel Stanley being implanted.

Her most notable success in the show ring includes Champion at Westmorland Show, Reserve Champion at the UK National Ayrshire Show, a three-time class

> winner at the Royal Highland Show and Champion Ayrshire in the ST Genetics online show that was held during covid.

As a brood cow, sons of her by Troutbeck Trump (x Halmyre Urr Lieutenant), Troutbeck Progress and Troutbeck Flawless (x Delta Webmail) and Troutbeck Show Stopper (x Schreur Apoll P-Red) have been heavily used both within the herd at Troutbeck and across the UK.

This year breeders will get the chance to use another son of hers, both in the UK and internationally, with the release of Troutbeck Daring. Daring is sired by one of the breeds most consistent bulls, Ardmore Crown Napier and will be available in both conventional and SEXED ULTRA HIGH PURITY straws. As well as having a great pedigree, he also has a very interesting genomic linear with him being a plus for PLI, production, protein %,

started The Jess family at Troutbeck when the family purchased Myerscough Jess 123 as a calf for £300 at 10 weeks old. The investment soon paid off as she won the National calf show and then calved in and won at the Royal Highland as a milking heifer. She bred many VG and EX progeny which included Troutbeck Touchdown Jess VG85, Dam of Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3, who had

yields up to 11,041KG in 305 days with a fat % of 4.79 and protein of 3.16. She scored EX92 (3E) and produced over 80 tonnes of milk.

A firm favourite at Troutbeck since the day she was born, Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3 has achieved many top honours at shows as well as being a top milker by consistently achieving over 10,000Kgs milk since her third lactation, whilst keeping desirable level of solids.

She started off her classification

milestones scoring VG86 as a 2 year old, VG88 as a second calver, maximum score EX93 as a third calver, EX94 as a fourth calver, EX95 as a fifth calver then EX96 as a sixth calver.

Not only looking the part, Jess has completed over 80 tonnes in her 8 lactations with her highest yield being her fifth lactation when she produced 12,517 KG in 305 days at 4.49% fat and 3.18% protein. Having only ever

fertility Index and all of the main type traits.

Brothers James and Philip Mattinson both sum up the Jess family very well "Both Jess 3 and her family excel for health traits, fertility and high production, meaning they are the type of cow that they love to own and work with".



The Ayrshires first arrived at Dale Head farm in 1950's from purchases from both Castle Douglas and Ayr markets. Around 50 years ago, Alf and his son Derek started registering the herd under the Heydale prefix. In the search for more milk in the 70's, Alf and Derek purchased bulls from Jim Rennie's Pant herd, and these were used heavily until the late 80's.

Peter joined the business in 1982 when he left school and had the passion to keep moving the herd forward and taking teams to major shows including the Great Yorkshire and the National Ayrshire show. Peter began introducing genetics from all over the world from top cow families in the late 90's and continues to use international breeding today. Two cow families you will see have been in the herd since the 60's, these are



the Ovoid's and the Winsome's where some of the best Heydale breeding has come from including the well known Cattle Services bull, Heydale White Willow. Other cow families to look out for are the Bronaras which were introduced to the herd from America, the S families all originate from the Normanton herd, the Model's came from Canada, The Ellas were purchased from Haresfoot, Ginny, Zinnias. Brown Kate and Bia Kate and Glitter families were all from Pant. The Pollv's. herd. Daphne's, Helen's. Flox. Jean. Jav. Olga, Cushv and Rose original **families** of the Moss are all

We had some great results last year both in and out the ring with Heydale Summertime VG87 winning the 4yr olds and Heydale Ovoid 365 EX93 taking champion at the Great Yorkshire Show. Heydale Progress Elaine won the 2yr old at the National Show at UK Dairy Day and we had our first ever All Britain and Ireland winners with Heydale Wingman Bronara VG86 winner of the 2 year olds (3rd in WAF photo comp) and Heydale Winsome 183 VG88 4 year old (3rd in WAF photo comp). We have sold cattle that have gone on and done well for their new owners. Heydale Dream Bronara became 9th gen EX for the Smartmove Syndicate. Heydale Ovoid's have featured in the top prices at the recent Rhos Dispersal and Winsomes at the Sunshine Dispersal. And most recent sale Heydale Winsome 209 now VG87 went on to win her class at the recent RUAS Winter Fair and was 3rd All Britain 3yr old. We welcome visitors to our home on 12th May. We hope you enjoy your visit.

2023 CONFERENCE HERD VISITS

The Adams family very much look forward to welcoming you.Joanna, Richard, and Andrew are the third generation to farm at Shirley Old Park Farm, after Grandfather Ben moved here in 1950. Robert and Jennifer took over on his retirement and some years later in 1999 became organic, supplying milk to OMSCO, which is still the case today as the Ayrshire cow fits perfectly in to their PWAB (anti-biotic free milk production) being such easy care, low maintenance and resilient cattle. Today the farm extends to around 500 acres – mainly grass with around 30 acres of whole crop. Reseeding with red clover and rye grass leys using whole crop as a break crop. Aims are to increase the amount of over seeding to improve production of existing grazing leys. The farm

runs 150 milk cows producing an average of: 6677kg - 4.06BF, 3.31PR on a mainly grazing system, with turnout from Mother's Day to Bonfire Night.

Almost all calves are reared with surplus heifers being sold to other organic herds around the country, while the bull calves, along with early lambs from 100 Dorset ewes go on to supply organic beef and lamb to Marks and Spencer's via Dawn Meats, Bridlington. Favourite cow families are the White Julia's and Mark Marie's. The breeding aims are to improve components whilst trying to use outcross sires and continuing to maintain close to 100% pure herd. Jo uses sexed or conventional semen for 2 services then the Hereford bull thereafter to breed for higher fertility and maintain the rolling 73% conception rate to 1st service. Alongside this farm a 280 acre organic hill farm is run at Alstonefield, home to the **Bigginvale** herd of Belted Galloways and 300 April lambing ewes also supplying Dawn Meats but the majority sold as boxed beef and lamb for the freezer.





Tessvale Ayrshires began in 1997 with five heifers from Messrs Renshaw's Sapperton herd, with the Margaret and Shamrock being successful families. More purchases were made from Mr Little's dispersal sale near York, including cow families:- Julia, Whiterose, Nigh, Gladys and Baby. With these cows we began farming a 30 acre Staffordshire County Council farm.

Cherryleaf, Cherryshine, Ester and Mary were added from my Father's Bigginvale herd. After only 12 months we moved to a larger 50 acre Council farm and rented additional land to support the cows, all youngstock and a flock of 150 ewes.

Very few cows have been purchased since, except Damson from William Biggin, Quartz and Rum from Brian Moorhouse and Marie tracing back to Hitcham Marie. Always wanting to breed our own



semen is used from Cattle Services young bull list. We also purchased three Holstein cows from J T Bunting, where I worked after leaving school for ten years - one successful family being Augusta which have been crossed with Ayrshires. Tessvale became a closed herd in 2009 after taking a private tenancy of 280 acres at Great Gate where we are today. Currently we milk 100 cows, rear all youngstock, have a flock 150 ewes and grow 30 acres of corn. Heifers are reared to calving and bull calves fattened intensively and sold direct to Dunbia or livestock auctions.

I believe Ayrshire cows should be a low maintenance animal, ours are kept on a simple system grazed for as long as possible, fed silage with a kilo of cereal in the feed trough and a blend in the parlour to a maximum of 5kg per day. With these low maintenance cows there have been no routine vet visits, fertility treatments or dry cow therapies used for 23 years.

Herd Stats: 6,570 litres per cow herd average @ 4.38 fat and 3.28 protein Calving index is 391 days. An average of 2.4 services per cow. Successful bulls for us have been Mark Samsson, Bigginvale Bright Night, McCornick Nelson, Grandage Bright Spark, Hidden Valley Garth, Garthland Snowman, Ravenhill Enigma, Heydale Brooklyn, Stamford High Definition, Auchensale Lord Potter, Cuthill Towers Maddison, Bigginvale Destination, Whitecroft Dr Foster, Heydale White Willow.

The Alkmonton Ayrshire herd was established in August 2013 by Paul and Lenora along with son Richard. Having not milked before, Ayrshires were the breed of preference for their good all round ability, being able to graze and produce milk efficiently, of high quality over many lactations. Another factor of choosing the Ayrshire was the intention to process milk on farm, this became a reality in 2020 when Richard & his wife Jo started 'Alkmonton Dairy', which now processes 15,000 litres per week of the farms milk, selling direct into local businesses and homes. Here at Alkmonton Old Hall Farm, as well as the dairy herd, we have a mixture of beef, sheep and arable spread over approximately 1000 acres.

The herd today consists of around 180 cows, producing 6,500 litres per year at 4.6% butterfat, and 3.25% protein. For us, still being a relatively new herd, it is hard to pick a favourite cow family, but two that do stand out are the Lorna family, originally from Castern Ayrshires and the Magentas from the Pylon herd. We are currently using a variety of different bulls both old and new, as far back as Stewartry Royal Secret from 1977 all the way to Cuthill Towers Calcutta. A firm favourite in our herd is Wroughton Lord Winston, who's daughters have performed consistently well for us.

At present the dairy herd are fed a TMR which consists of grass silage, wholecrop wheat, and a homegrown blend of beans, lupins and barley. In the future we would like to increase the size of our herd, as our dairy processing enterprise continues to grow. We look forward to welcoming you all to the Derbyshire Conference in May this year.


The Broadley family look forward to welcoming delegates to Brundcliffe Farm, home of the Whitecroft herd. The herd was formed in in 1972 when John and Barbara purchased a couple of heifers from Otley, though registering didn't commence until 1982. The herd now consists of 150-160 milkers plus followers running alongside 50-60 Holsteins under the Brundcliffe prefix. with John and Barbara now retired it's their sons Andrew (Society President) and Michael (CSA Director & Breed Heritage Chairman) that run the business with full time help from Andrew's eldest son Ben and 2 part time staff Gavin & Jo. The current herd average is 8082kg 4.09bf 3.34pr 601kg f&p with a 386 day calving interval. Calving is all year round with a slight bias towards autumn. The breeding policy has been pretty much dairy orientated for the last few years but with all youngstock being contract reared away from the homestead and with costs rising more beef semen has started to be used.

The majority of Ayrshire semen is sourced from Cattle Services (AYR) Ltd while there is always a bull in the pen. Young bulls are generally supported with Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Plaskett Bruno, Grove Razell, Pam Ayrs Heirloom, Alkmonton Stardust and Brieryside Hail in the flask alongside some Tontine Astorwell and a couple of privately sourced bulls.

There are currently 14 Pam Ayrs Hawaiian daughters milking with others impressing by Biddesden Hector and Harperfield Wind in The Willows. The cows are grazed through the summer with turnout mid to late April and housing late September/October depending on the weather. We are currently looking at herbal leys with a view to further reducing fertilizer usage and lowering the risk of drought with their deep rooting structure.

We have used Pruex,, this year's conference major sponsor for the last 2 years, with a view to minimising antibiotic and disinfectant use on the herd. Pruex use a Bacilas based bacteria and treat the cows drinking water, cubicle beds and calf pens, post dip is no longer used in after milking as the cows leave the parlour and travel through a "Cynthia" which sprays a mist of the bacteria over them reducing clinical cases of mastitis, Digital Dermatitis and sores, meaning footbaths are a thing of the past. You will be able to see the "Cynthia" in action when you visit.

2023 CONFERENCE HERD VISITS



The late John Edward Woolley 1932-2022, written by John Woolley (3rd Generation) and Jesse Bostock

John passed away at his home, Earlsway House Farm, Rushton Spencer in December 2022, aged 90.

In 1948 along with his father they held a farm sale and subsequently made the trip to Scotland purchasing fourteen pedigree Ayrshires while living at Wragg Hall Farm, Biddulph Park, Staffordshire. In 1955 John had the chance to test the ground at Earlsway House Farm, eventually purchasing it in 1965 for £6,000.00. John always bred his own replacements, and along with the original fourteen heifers the "Earlsway" herd was named.

John, along with his family were very proud of their Ayrshires and they were good cattle. In 1978 the Slater cup stock judging event was held at Earlsway and was very well attended. It was contested between Staffordshire, Shropshire, Cheshire, #Derbyshire and Northwest Ayrshire breeders. The master judge was Mr James Waterhouse, York. For the first time it was a three generation team that were the winners, J.S Bostock Snr, J.A Bostock Jnr and J.D Bostock.

John purchased pedigree Ayrshire bulls from Evan Sherratt of Knypersley Hall, Reg Critchlow of Onecote Grange, John Critchlow of Stanton Dale and lastly Eyton Valient from Dodd Brothers at Sheriffhales Manor. Then, using well bred AI bulls from Townhead, Dilham, Hammond, Brocklehill, Pant, Bank End, Meredith and Eyton.

In 2000 the Earlsway herd came 3rd place with 901 points for the Midlands Counties Cup production Ayrshire herds in the Staffordshire Milk Records Competition. Finally retiring in 2001 a farm sale was booked and the 200 head "Earlsway" herd was advertised in The Ayrshire journal. Sadly due to the foot and mouth outbreak it was cancelled. John Gibson of Biggin Grange, Thorpe had the pick of the milkers buying 50 with the rest going on the scheme which was heart breaking. Phillip and Thelma Jeffries, Welshpool purchased the in calf and maiden heifers.

The high esteem and respect in which John held was evident by the 180 congregation members that filled St Lawrences Church, Biddulph for the service with the burial following at Rushton Church.

and in 1999 Willhome Ayrshires were established. Through the next 23 years, our family had great success at local and national shows and were the Haresfoot Vase winners in 2013. A few Willhome bulls are available in bull studs (W. Challenger and W. Pams Horizon to name a couple), I won the prestigious Hugh Stevenson Award and have travelled to many countries judging and a highlight has been Philip having the honour of being the **Ayrshire Cattle Society President. This** lifetime of work, irrespective of breed has now been taken by bovine TB; a total of 650 head were taken following various skin and blood tests over a 3 year period, with no animal showing a positive reaction on slaughter.

However, unbeknown to us. There really is life without milking cows. Eight weeks after the last bovine was loaded, we opened our gates to our new venture. 4 years of planning and constructing 'Willhome Farm Barn' was our new and exciting

diversification project. The initial idea was set up whilst we had a herd to milk and the opening hours of 'the barn' would slot in between. With the business aim of increasing revenue from outside of milk sales and take some control of a part of the business as the family would have the decision of what to offer and prices to charge, but it's also money from outside of agriculture.

Willhome Farm Barn is an interactive farm showcasing a full variety of farm animal species available to feed, touch and walk. This hands on experience also works parallel with the factual information on show to inform visitors of the 'farm to fork' journey. To display how animals change and adjust throughout the seasons, therefore, 'the barn' is open throughout the year.

WILLHOME FARM BARN Stuart Williams shares his journey from pedigree into farm diversification

Picture this... a dairy farm with no gates rattling, no vacuum pump sounding and not even a calf shouting... just silence! This is what we were faced with in May 2022 following the entire depopulation of the remaining bovines at our South Wales farm. Philip and Sharon, along with myself (Stuart Williams) have always had dairy cows on the farm. In the early 1980's Philip graded up the herd of Holsteins Why this diversification? Many have asked. Simply, to fill in the gap between producers and consumers. As a family, we have always tried to support various educational days hosted in Pembrokeshire over the years. Whilst milking a Holstein and an Ayrshire on display at a pancake day event; explaining where the ingredients for pancakes come from, a teacher of a local primary school (who went to school with me) asked the simple question "so, the black and white gives us normal milk, does the red one produce strawberry milkshake?". That was it, we knew there was a gap to fill! Whatever we do, family is key and this new venture is no different. Animal care and handling, café, entrance and maintenance is all done by family. But equally when turning the vision into reality, the youth of the family were of utmost of importance. Animals were child proofed, to be as friendly as possible and the layout is safe to ensure children can be





seen from all areas. However, the biggest lesson we have learnt from each other and maintain to be important for our business, is to keep it simple. General public want a simple experience, an easy day out and enjoy simplicity. The café serves basic meals, snacks and drinks but the biggest enjoyment is no WIFI! All this also enables Willhome to keep it's prices to a minimum, therefore offer a value for money day out!

Since opening EDUCATIONAL VISITS have highlighted the success of the business. Within the first couple of weeks of being open, many school trips were received but as the new academic year started last September, the interest was proven furthermore. By the end of the first term Willhome Farm Barn had, and continues to have (until the end of the year) a minimum of 10 academic groups visiting a week, with some weeks increasing to up to

15 a week. With an age range of three years to 16 years. The strength of its' educational link is proven further more by County Council executives wanting to work closely with the provision for all students.

Outside of education, general visitors are supporting the business in their droves and it's left us speechless and overwhelmed. BIRTHDAY PARTIES for all ages have been a huge success, in the first nine months of trading, an average of 1.6 parties have been held per week, with future bookings of birthdays, christenings, weddings and team building days extending into 2024. All of this has given a very pleasing reward since opening and we are delighted to be nominated for many prestigious national awards in 2023, including; a couple of nominations for the 'Start-up business of the year awards' in various sections.

What is on the main farm? Is a question asked by visitors. Well, after a full cleanse and disinfection of the whole farm yard, buildings and slurry storage, and following an inspection by the ministry, bovines were allowed to return just over 6months after they were removed. The farm now holds 120 beef cattle (weaned through to fat cattle), along with a small herd of Pedigree Highland cattle to keep the Pedigree Welsh Pig herd company.

PEDIGREE DAIRY CATTLE ARE BACK! Yes, it was an emotional day for the whole family but very recently we have welcomed a couple of Brown Swiss heifers back to the farm for 'Willhome Take 2'. These girls have brought back a special smile to all the family and visitors alike as they are placed in the Barn, ready to breed and start milking again.

FUTURE PLANS are not written in stone but for now for the dairy herd, ideally, enough milk will be created for the café and to sell as pasteurised whole milk from the Willhome dairy cows! In the Farm Barn, we are waiting for new paddocks to be created to extend for a few additional farm animals. The aim is, to continue to educate people about food and farming in safe and enjoyable environment for the whole family.

Thanks must go to all who have supported us throughout the last period of our lives, who have mutual love of dairy cows. To Ayrshire breeders worldwide but especially to UK breeders Alan Timbrell, Blaise Tomlinson, Lisa Window, Wendy Young, Dave Christophers and Jake Sayer for your constant support and keeping us focused as a family. The support has helped us continue, helped us to get out of bed and more importantly, to keep going with our diversification to prove there is a life outside of milking cows!

SON PEDIGR WROUGHTON AYRSHIRES A hidden Jewel in Wiltshire

In 1972. Mike and Rosemary Windel took over the tenancy of 59 acres at Whitehouse Farm near Swindon "with two cows, two kids, a dog and no money". Since then, Mike and Rosemary along with their son Russell have worked hard to build the world renowned Wroughton herd. A herd that is packed with high producing, well bred cows is a must see for any Avrshire enthusiast that is ever visiting the area. Mike is the third generation of his family to farm, and he

The cows graze from April to November and are fed a total mixed ration in the winter that 07793 812234 includes grass silage and a 22% blend. Cows are fed concentrates in the parlour and have access to out of parlour feeders.

The dry cows are on a ration of grass silage, barley straw and pre calving rolls and pre calving they are moved onto 10kg of the milk cow ration plus ad lib barley straw which sees the herd have no issues with milk fever or displaced stomachs.

Calves are reared on milk powder and ad lib course mix and are weaned between 8-12 weeks and then moved onto an 18% concentrate with ad lib straw. At 5 months they move onto silage, chopped straw and concentrate up to being turned out

got started with the help of his uncle who gave him cows and the use of his machinery in return for labour. From these cows, Mike built the herd up gradually alongside the purchase of heifers Montv Stallard's from sale and others purchased through **Reading market.** Mikes intention was always to build the farm up, so he took every opportunity to take on extra land as it came up and today the farm totals 130 acres at Whitehouse with a further 90 acres of grass keep rented close by.

Today the family milk 180 cows and rear around 150 followers and the milk is sold to Waitrose. The herd currently averages 7,300 litres at 4.41% BF and 3.37% Protein and a cell count of 127 on twice a day milking.

Mike prefers to treat heifers on an individual basis and serve them when they are big enough so calves them anywhere between 24 and 30 months. Mike also does the same for the milking herd, he will not serve cows early if they are milking well.

The main drive is to have a good margin over concentrate which is

currently sitting at £2200 and one of the reasons the family keeps Ayrshires on the farm as they admire the longevity, great leas and feet, their grazing ability meaning he can stock them tighter, "more pretty than other breeds" says Rosemary. Mike has always been passionate about Ayrshires, "my father kept them and it was the only breed of cow he ever wanted to milk".

Over the years Mike has learnt so much from other breeders but he says Edward Evans, Monty Stallard and Alan Timbrell are people he has looked up to most within the breed.

At 75 years young, Mike has no plans of slowing down and still works full time on the farm alongside son Russell and one full time worker as well as running a full contractor service. Despite recent health challenges, Mikes passion to farm and breed Ayrshire cows is still as strong as ever, and the family look forward to showcasing their herd when they kindly host a visit for the World Ayrshire Conference next year.

Heifer get two chances of sexed semen and then they run with an Angus bull to sweep up. Cows are served to either Ayrshire or beef (Blue or Angus). Avrshire sires in the flask at the moment are West **Mossgiel Modern Reality, Ardmore** Crown Napier, Plaskett Bruno, **Rosehill Vitality and Brieryside** Magic.

Mikes favourite cow families are the Janet, Nina, and Alice families. The Alice family goes back to Wroughton Alice who produced 128 tonnes of milk which at the time, was a world record for a pure Avrshire cow. Current favourite cows at the farm are Wroughton Hilda EX94 sired by Wroughton Lord Winston who is in her 9th lactation, Wroughton Mayflower EX92 who is a Haresfoot Panache daughter and is milking in her 5th lactation and her VG87 2 year old daughter Wroughton Mayflower 2 who is sired by Wroughton Lord Winston, as well as Wroughton Stripe VG89 who took Champion

The herd runs on a very simple grass/grass silage system topped to yield in the parlour and averaging 7400kg at 4.4% fat 3.3% protein.

Breeding contains Canadian, American and Swedish, but predominantly British genetics always looking for that blend of production and type with the aim to maintain or increase PLI and with a high percentage of purity. A JOINED-UP APPROACH TO CALF SCOUR PAYS OFF



Calf mortality in the period from one day of age to weaning is estimated to be around 6% for dairy calves, at a cost to the industry of £11.6 million per annum1. The latest RUMA (Responsible Use of Medicines in Agriculture) Targets

Task Force report highlights an aim to reduce calf mortality rates by 1% per year, so improving the sustainability of the sector and reducing losses. One of the main causes of calf mortality is scour or diarrhoea.

Watery stools, blood and mucus, sunken eyes and tenting skin; most farmers will be familiar with the nightmare of calf scour which can be a frustratingly common problem.

Calf scour impacts animal welfare and calves with scour become more susceptible to other diseases. In addition, they suffer delayed development and are much more likely to die. Inevitably, calf scour hits farm finances too, with investigations, diagnosis and treatment costs adding to decreased calf growth rate, reduced production in the first lactation and increased age at first calving1,2.

Outbreaks of scour are usually caused by nutritional disturbances, or one or more infectious agents, such as rotavirus, coronavirus, E. coli or Salmonella species. Risk factors include hygiene issues in calving yards and calf housing.

A standard operating procedure (SOP) or protocol developed with input from your vet and shared with all team members can really help spot early signs and give valuable guidance on actions to take. Treatment will include:

Rehydration therapy - oral or intravenous fluid with electrolytes aims to reduce the impact of diarrhoea and regulate acid levels in body fluids. Continuing feeding milk as well as electrolyte rehydration therapy provides calves with energy and improves their gut health. Rehydration therapy may include the use of Daikur® Plus a nutritional supplement for calves and a source of energy and electrolytes.

Antimicrobials - not to be used routinely for calf scour, but may be prescribed by your vet for calves with diarrhoea that show systemic signs of illness, such as fever, or if calves have blood in their faeces.

NSAIDs – non-steroidal anti-inflammatories (NSAIDs) such as Metacam® - will help to decrease gut pain and inflammation. They can also decrease fever, which increases the likelihood of the calf consuming more milk and, therefore, more fluids and energy.

Preventative steps

"Prevention is preferable to cure" is something that applies to many aspects of farming, and calf health management is an obvious area. Scour can affect very young calves and preventing it is always preferable to stop it taking hold and having longlasting effects.

Key preventative measures:

• Hygiene and biosecurity – regular, deep cleaning and keep the milk prep area as clean as your own kitchen

• Colostrum management – boost its quality with good dry cow management and optimal transition. The aim is to get 10% of bodyweight of good quality colostrum delivered to the calf within six hours of birth, ideally with the first feed being given within two hours. • Vaccination – administering a vaccine to the dam in the dry period boosts colostral antibodies. Fencovis® is a new inactivated rotavirus, coronavirus and E. coli K99 calf scour vaccine available in the UK and is the first which is licensed to prevent scour caused by rotavirus and E. coli K99. The vaccine is only available from vets (POM-V) and is distinct from others on the market as it comes with an oil-free adjuvant.

Fencovis® is indicated for the active immunisation of pregnant heifers and cows to stimulate the development of antibodies against rotavirus, coronavirus and E. coli K99. Calves are born without circulating antibodies, so they are entirely reliant on antibody rich colostrum to transfer immunity against infections in the first hours, days and weeks of life.

Everyone looking after calves should adhere to high standards of hygiene at all times and be well versed in what to look out for and when to take action. With a robust preventative strategy in place, you are reducing the risk to the calf and giving them the best possible start.

loose rapidly and soon the housing and milking parlour became overloaded. 100 more cubicles and 60 more acres followed, in 1981 a new 20:20 herringbone another and 800 gallon tank, then 200 more acres in 1984 for the expanding herd of 270 milkers.

The East Sussex Ayrshire Cattle Club was floundering, Jeanne and her friend Joyce Clark brought it back to life! Joyce became secretary, Jeanne did four two year terms as Chairman.

They rejuvenated the Herd Competition, Stock Judging and annual Dinner Dance. In 1990 Jeanne organised the annual calf and young handler show at Lane End. Entries from Kent Surrey and East and West Sussex made it hugely until when successful 2000 movement regulations made things too difficult, and it was incorporated into the Edenbridge and Oxted show where it continues to be a very important part of the competitions.

Starting with eight **Avrshire** type cows, а wheelbarrow, shovel and a lot of enthusiasm. Soon the fourteen stall shed was filled with cheap but good old cows. Jeanne took charge of calf rearing and the bulls. Numbers grew



Jeanne was a keen member of the NFU, helping and organising many of the fund raising events. She served as branch representative on the County RABI committee for many years.

Jeanne also served as Council Member for Region 14 and was honoured to act as finance convenor. Showing cattle was a very special and important part of Jeanne's life for over 50 years, with successes too numerous to catalogue.

She enjoyed a challenge and took a Charolais cross heifer to the Smithfield fat stock show at Earls Court and was delighted to be placed fourth in a big class. The European Dairy Event at Stoneleigh each autumn was very special to Jeanne and after the first year to suss out the routine, she won at least one production class each year and was very proud to win Supreme Production Champion in 1992. She also won the Clean Milking Award three times. Above all she loved the strength camaraderie between the breeders. of

The 1991 the Spring Journal arrived with an advert for the Australian Ayrshire Centenary Celebration, Jeanne said shall we go? Great organiser that she was, Round the world airline tickets were bought, the milkers were booked to be sold and the bags were packed. 220 milkers were sold on 4th September 1991, and we left for Australia on 19th September. With 140 in calf heifers awaiting our return. A fantastic month travelling with Ayrshire breeders from around the world, visiting Australian Ayrshire breeders in such varying the parts of country was followed by great month а in New Zealand, then Los Angeles for a short stay in America and finally back to the joy of starting all over again with the young stock and bulls.

There were two more reduction sales in 2008 and 2014, but the Pylon herd continues!

Jeanne loved her Ayrshires and they allowed us to travel to many counties in the UK for National conferences and many countries for World Conferences.

Jeanne leaves David, a daughter and 3 sons. 6 grandchildren, 8 great grandchildren and so many young farmers and cattle people who called her Mrs Heasman but looked to her as Mum.


