NORTHERN IRELAND RE-TAGGING PROCEDURE

Have you bought animals from Great Britain?

We kindly request that members from Northern Ireland inform the office if animals have been bought and imported from Great Britain that have been re-tagged with Northern Ireland ear tags.

The animal will remain registered with the society and will still be recognised by the original herd book number and name. It will also retain its full pedigree, and any other information including DNA, Genomic, Progeny, Milk records, Classifications, etc.

For us to update the ear tag number, we require a copy of the Ministry documents showing the changes along with the details of when you purchased the animal. Once updated, we will issue a new pedigree certificate in your ownership. If you require any further information, or to update your records, please contact the office.

UPDATE ON GENOMICS

As at the end of August, we have over 700 genomic submissions from UK Ayrshires which will help our cause to gain a higher reliability on the information we receive. Unfortunately, we have had to deal with several issues from our service providers, but we are pleased to inform you that many of these issues have been resolved. One major factor has been that some submissions have been processed with incorrect identities which resulted in them not being processed. 260 submissions with incorrect identities have been identified and have been processed in the August proof run. To avoid future issues all submissions must carry their Herd Book number as their identity, not their tag number, no matter which service provider you use.

Being a small breed, we do struggle with numbers and that will always be the biggest hurdle for Ayrshire genotyping. We will never achieve the high reliabilities which the Holstein breed has because our population will not allow it! Balancing the costs involved against the value of information received is a concern to many of you and we understand that. For any of you who are testing and to achieve maximum gains from the information you receive you must test in large groups. The testing of all females in batches will help you to identify the breeding and production potential of each individual to assist with future decisions within your breeding policy. Look at the production, health and fertility traits, conformation traits and identify any haplotypes. Remember that genomics is a breeding tool, and you should always remember to consider your pedigrees and the value of consistency within your cow families.

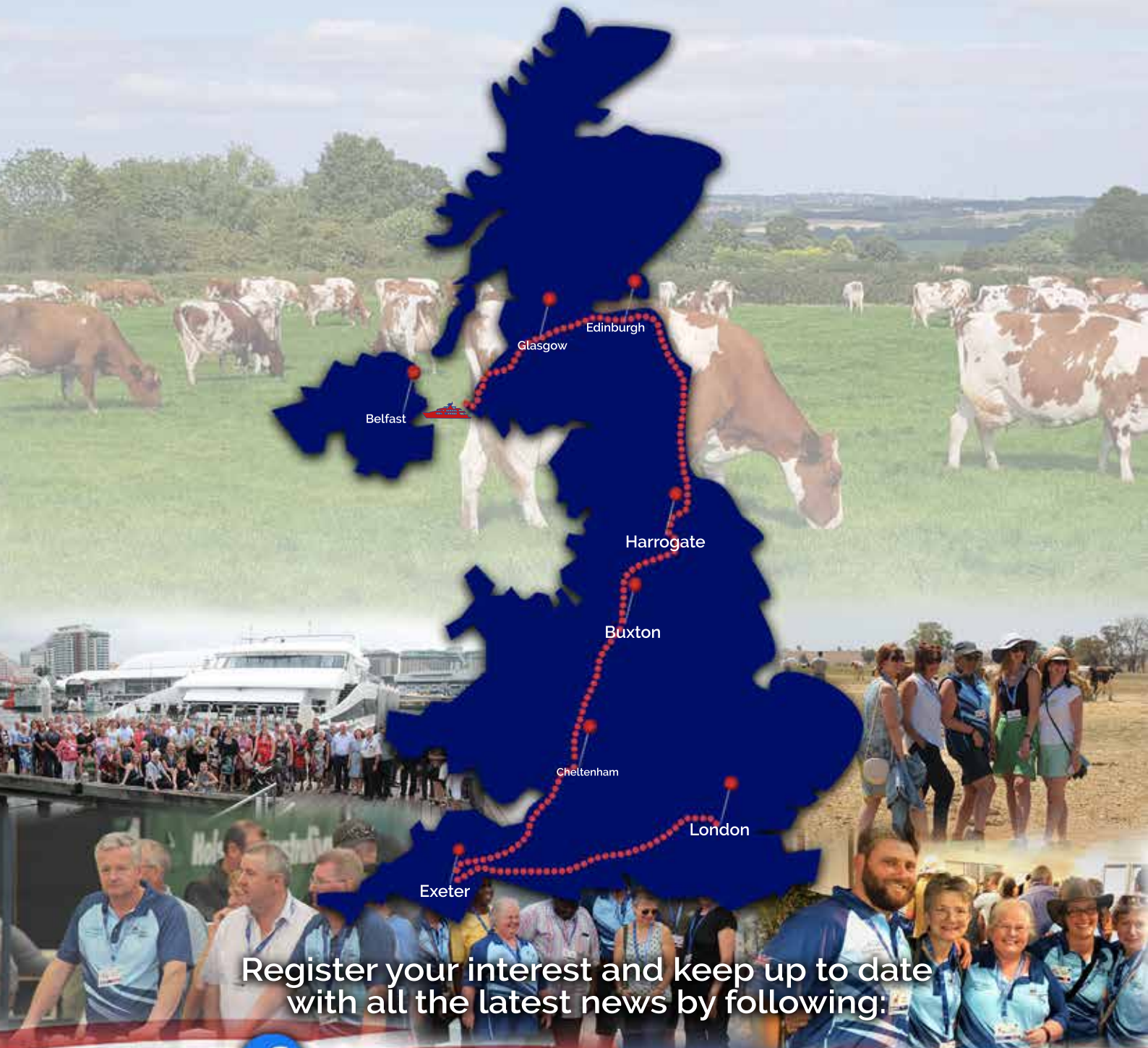

INTERNATIONAL ASSIGNMENT

Sam Wake judges in Sweden

In early April, I was invited to Sweden to judge their Spring show. After cancelled flights, car parking issues and fun getting through customs (I don't think I look that dodgy!!), I was collected from Gothenburg airport by my host, Klas Johansson, who has been distributing UK Ayrshire semen for Cattle Services in Sweden. We then drove around three hours to our first farm visit; I could not believe how quiet a country Sweden was - we only saw five people out walking the entire journey. The cows at the first farm were Holsteins that were owned by Ann and Jonas Nilsson; the family had shown a lot over the years, and you could see this as the herd was full of great cows.

After this, we moved onto Tockarp Farm which was a herd of Ayrshires owned by Patrik Isaksson and Malin Knutsson. We had a superb visit around their tie stall barn. It was great to see some tremendous cows by Ardmore Crown Napier, they also had many great cows sired by Canadian bulls.

Next, we moved onto Klas Johansson and Anja Dalhog's herd. They had recently moved the cattle into a new dairy set up with cubicles and parlour. Above the barn was a lovely farm shop that Anja runs, selling a range of home-made dairy products. The barn was full of exceptional cows and heifers that included daughters of the following UK Sires: Green Lane Marshall, Rosehill Real McCoy, Twemlow Admiral Glen, Rosehill Manderville,



Moathouse Monopoly, Biddesden
Hector and Hilltown Oblique.

After this, we went to the show which was held in the city of Skara. I had a meal with the show committee and exhibitors who all seemed very relaxed the night before a show. It was very interesting to meet with people and find out about their farming systems and which bulls and families that have worked for them.

The next day was judging day and I had a full day of judging which included the Ayrshires, Holsteins, and Jerseys. The standard of all the breeds was strong. In the Ayrshire classes, the Junior Champion was the fantastic calf called 190 Princess (sired by La Sapiniere Chelyote) from Patrick Isaksson and in the cow classes, the Champion was from Leif Larsson with 1361 Tometta (sired by an American bull Pedro).

After the show, Anja took me to the farm of Robert and Frida Albertsson. They milked their cows in a tie stall barn but housed them in a cubicle barn. The herd was full of strong milky cows and the youngstock pens were full of exciting heifers by Ravenhill Victory, Pam Ayr's Hawaiian and Moathouse Monopoly. After this, I was again treated to fantastic hospitality with the Albertsson family and Anja before being taken back to the airport, ready for my early morning flight home.

I would like to thank Klas and Anja for asking me to judge and all the great people I met during this visit. For any cow enthusiast, a trip to Sweden is a must - there are some great cows and fantastic people there.

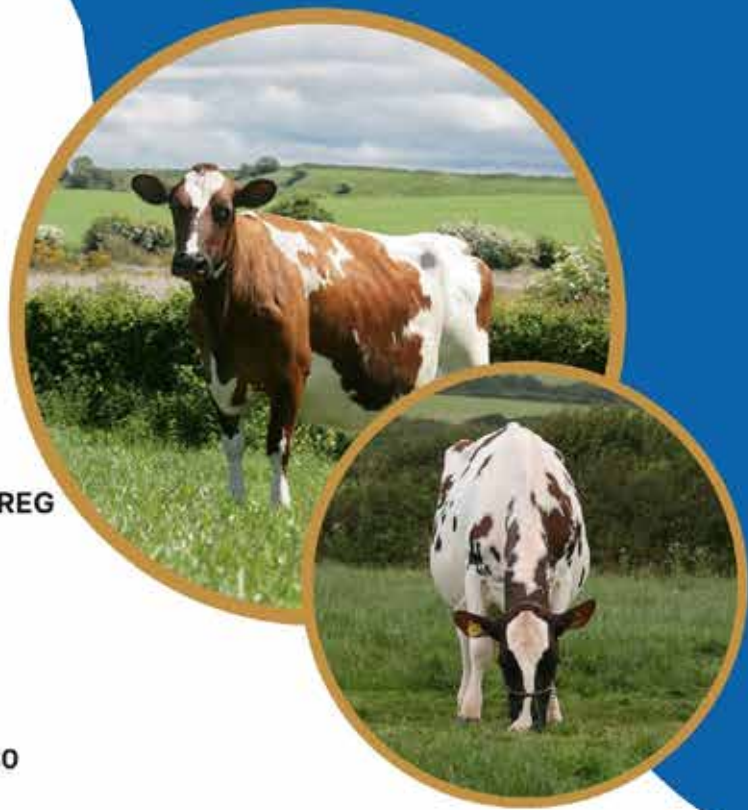

INVESTMENT PAYS OFF



Upgrading milking facilities is a major investment and decision for any business. After exploring many options, the Rennie family from Brocklehill Farm, Annbank, Ayr invested in two DeLaval VMS V310 robots.

"Our parlour was 18 years old, so we knew we were going to have to make an investment of some sort. We looked at all sorts of options, but robots were the obvious choice for us," said Shaun, who was milking 180 head twice daily through the parlour.

While still milking 60 low yielders through the parlour twice a day, the 120 high yielders are now milking 3 times or more through the DeLaval VMS V310 robots.

"The team of engineers from Fullwoodhead Dairy Supplies

Ltd worked hard to install the new robots quickly and efficiently. It is a reflection of the dedication and hard work of the Rennie family and the nature of the cows, how well they have both settled into the new system. I'd like to thank the Rennie's for using Fullwoodhead Dairy Supplies Ltd and we look forward to supporting them in the future," said Scott Wilson, Director at Fullwoodhead Dairy Supplies Ltd.

Brocklehill Farm is situated around 10 minutes from Fullwoodhead Dairy Supplies Ltd's main depot at Ayr Market; this along with their excellent relationship with the business was a key deciding factor for the Rennie's.

Since installing the robots, average milk yields have increased to 38kg a day, in comparison to 31kg a day in the parlour, at 4.4BF% and 3.3P%.

"Quality and quantity are both hugely important to us, we get paid a bonus for BF and P, so it is crucial that we continue to keep them high," said Keith adding that all milk is sold on contract to Caledonian Cheese.

The Rennie family plan to add another 2 robots to allow all cows to be milked through robots in the future.

A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE LORD PLUMB

HONORARY PRESIDENT OF THE AYRSHIRE CATTLE SOCIETY

With the passing of Lord Plumb, agriculture has lost one of its most influential men whose dedication, drive, and hard work as President of the NFU and Honorary President of the Ayrshire Cattle Society has benefitted everyone in our industry. I had the honour of working closely with Henry during my 14 years as General Secretary of the Ayrshire Cattle Society and 20 years as Secretary of the World Federation of Ayrshire Breed Societies.

Outstanding was the background work he did in 1976 and 1977 to make the largest Ayrshire World Conference ever such an international success and a great credit to the UK. Henry also travelled to Brazil with me when the society sent out a plane load of Ayrshires and he judged the classes at their national show in Porto Allegro.

Henry was always very friendly and helpful, and we remained close and good friends until his very sad passing. He was a one in a million.

Many tributes have been paid and published about Lord Henry Plumb which are all so very true. My husband, Chris Window, started working alongside Henry at the age of seventeen on his farm, Southfields, with his Ayrshire herd. When Henry became the president of the National Federation of Young Farmers and vice president and president of the NFU, he asked Chris if he would take charge of the dairy herd, which he did so for 17 years. Whenever Henry came home, he always spent time with his cows and was interested in all the breeding policies that had been followed. He treated us as family (Karen, Lisa and myself), not a handshake but a hug. From the day we started farming on our own with more than his blessing and good wishes and as busy and committed he was, he always kept in touch. He took so much pleasure in visiting shows – Royal Dairy Event seeing the Sailor Girls and Fragy families winning, especially when in a championship as both families originated from his herd at Southfields. "Ayrshires were his passion" Henry came to Horsepool to view the cows and the breeding many times. On his last visit with the mid-term World Conference, he said he would not have missed it for the world.



During later years, Chris and Henry had many discussions by phone referring to the current issues in the farming world, this was continued by Lisa in recent years which Henry said he looked forward to, especially hearing of the recent Fragy 12 when she went EX97. As a family, we are proud to have been part of Henry's life and we valued his friendship. We mourn his loss and fondly remember.

The Window Family

When I first met Lord Plumb, my father was the first chairman of the New Cumbria NFU. I was appointed the YFC representative to attend the NFU AGM in London, Henry was a very approachable and caring gentleman, who made one feel completely at ease when in his company.

I have very fond memories of the Royal Show, showing against the Plumb - Window team, being placed second, when they won. One Royal, we had a cow close to calving and my father phoned Henry on route to leave the cow at Coleshill. I later phoned Henry to get an update on the cow, (no mobile then!) she had calved a small calf which was great, Henry went to check her and got a surprise, another heifer calf giving us "twin heifers" when we went to collect her, Henry said "another surprise" she had also calved a bull calf, so we took home triplets. The heifers were free martins and the bull went on to be Middle Satellite.

Henry was our obvious choice to speak at Society events and I was delighted when he agreed to be Guest Speaker at our Cumbrian conference in 2015. My last visit to Coleshill was

shortly after Lady Marjorie had passed away. I spent time with Henry, and he told me many stories, one when he left school and bought 16 Ayrshire heifers for £16 each, the Fragy family being within that group. When I left, he said "Willie, that's the best hour and a half since Lady Marjorie died," he loved his family, his cows and all his farming. He was a great man, and it was a great honour to have known him, and to have him as Honorary President of the Ayrshire Cattle Society.

MEET THE ABAB JUDGE

Stuart Williams is married to Vicky and has two daughters, Eva (3) and Ella (1). In partnership with his parents, they farm 240 acres in Camrose, Pembrokeshire. The farm would normally run a milking herd of 180 Pedigree Holsteins, Ayrshires, and Brown Swiss along with youngstock, under the "Willhome" prefix. Unfortunately, their whole herd was lost in April due to bTB and now Stuart owns one Brown Swiss heifer in Scotland and one Ayrshire in Australia with over 70 embryos of numerous families in stock. Currently the farm

is down to grass, with 50 acres of Spring Barley.

The Willhome prefix is also carried to the pedigree Welsh Pig herd of 50 breeding sows and a number of other farm animal species. This has led the family to open 'Willhome Farm Barn', an interactive farm where visitors can feed and stroke numerous farm animals and also learn the use to both farmers and consumers.



The Willhome dairy herd enjoyed great success showing at local, regional, and national shows with all three breeds, the highlights being:- winning Supreme Champion at the Royal Welsh Show in 2012 and in 2016 they won the Fitzhugh Dairy Pairs at the Royal Welsh with two homebred cows. Along with winning classes at the National Shows for both the Ayrshire and Brown Swiss breeds. In 2013 Willhome won the coveted Haresfoot Vase as GB & Ireland Premier Breeder Exhibitor. Along with this success, there are currently five Willhome bulls available in a couple of bull studs.

Stuart has travelled across the UK with the Willhome herd and many other herds, of various breeds, with much success in all home countries. For over 10 years he has also travelled Europe fitting and showing cattle and more recently judging a few national shows. In 2020, Stuart fitted the 'Boldview' string for the Ayrshire World Conference at International Dairy Week, Australia, where they won the Premier Breeder. He has also had the opportunity to strap the one and only 'Ruth' for 'Palmyra' on the coloured shavings, World Dairy Expo, Madison, USA. Throughout his local and international travels, he has experienced immense success and huge enjoyment from this by conversing with like minded people and working with some of the world's best cows.

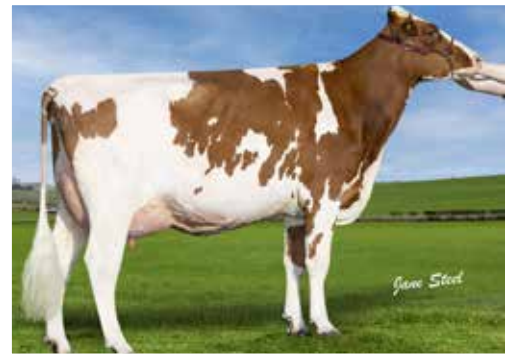
CARNELL SALE REPORT

29th June 2022

The Carnell Pedigree Ayrshire herd, who celebrated a Century of breeding Ayrshires back in 2015, was dispersed in front of a huge crowd of buyers, family & friends, and neighbours from across the UK and Ireland. Not often does the opportunity arise for unlimited access to one of the breeds oldest herds where such quality animals were offered for sale.

The majority of lots offered were all bred from deep pedigrees with Excellent and Very Good classified dams all with outstanding milking production bred from attractive and highly valued sires.

The sale topped at 4,400gns twice for two special cows with the milking cows and heifers averaging over £2100. The young heifer calves attracted buyers from several of the dairy breeds and topped at 2,800gns on two occasions to average £1215. Almost 50% of the herd sold for or more than £2000 with buyers recorded from 23 counties across the UK and Ireland.

Breed Heritage Programme

Welcome back Duncan Hunter who is managing the Breed Heritage Programme on our behalf.



BREED HERITAGE UPDATE

All breed societies have an obligation, and in fact is demanded by the charities commission to protect and enhance their breed, by achieving maximum purity within its population to safeguard its future. At the same time, it should be mindful not

to discriminate against breeders who introduce outside blood to breed an animal to suit their systems and businesses. The Ayrshire breed and its Society have created the opportunity to facilitate for all requirements for which the Society and its members should be commended on.

The Breed Heritage programme was introduced to fulfil the breeds obligations by identifying cow families to make an impact on the future of the breed and to assist in helping breeders with suggested breeding options for the next generation. The programme has achieved much success for many cow families over the years, but it does not come without its challenges! We have created some questions with relevant answers to help you understand the work which goes on behind the scenes and we remind everyone that this project will certainly help us with future challenges within the industry!

How do Breed Heritage identify animals for the programme?

Many great families exist in the UK, and they all have much to offer. We are very fortunate to have a great data base in the UK where pedigrees can be located giving us a wealth of information on a cow families background and its current active data. The committee are dedicated to searching and having knowledge of families we should be considering.

We also rely heavily on the membership to help us identify animals within their herds or those they know of, which may be of interest.

What are the required merits of an animal on the Breed Heritage programme?

We will consider its depth of pedigree, Consistency, production, health traits, and type. It's important to understand how the animal performs within its own herd as production varies with different input systems in UK dairy herds. We have a set standard of an animal that she should not lose more than three months in time in its first three lactations to strengthen fertility within the breed.

Can you identify some of the breeds families you are working with?

Many families being worked with will be very familiar to you all such as Sandy Rose, Magenta, Punch, Wren, Spankie, Pamela, Ella, Rosie, Violet, Ethel, Cherry, Ray, Barby, Hawaii, Charm, Snowball, and Heather Honey. Others which will no doubt make future impact to the breed are Barbara, Wellcome, Star, Present, Emma, Myra, Candy, and Mavis. There are many others but far too many to list.

Are the animals all 100% pure on the programme?

Not at all. The aim is to bring many families lost to outside blood back to purity or as near as possible and we have many examples of success in this area. With cooperation from breeders, we have made significant gains in raising the percentage of Ayrshire blood in many families both on the mainland and in Northern Ireland. We also must respect some breeder's requests to keep a little outside blood within their own families.

What are the criteria on sires for suggested matings?

Obviously, the gene pool is not huge in a small breed and with the high use of sexed semen this will only become more of a challenge. We search for the highest production and components sires available from around the world and take into consideration their health and fertility status. We also check for haplotypes and recessives and consider inbreeding value. Outcross sires are often required but are limited. We do hope future Breed Heritage projects will expand our genetics available in the UK.

Do breeders always accept the suggested mating's from Breed Heritage?

Not always. Some suggestions are not always accepted by the breeder, or the semen may not have been delivered on time and sometimes in the past the communication has been lost, but we do our best to convince the breeder that we have put a great deal of thought to our suggestions and hope it is appreciated and taken on. We always continue to monitor these animals and record their progeny. We can never assume our suggestions made are the right one, but what we can say is that we have taken the time, put in the thought, and suggested what we think is the best available choice. We have no guarantees!

What is the current situation with genomic selection?

As we all know this is a controversial subject regarding a breed of relatively low numbers. A base was formed several years ago, and it requires large numbers of females to be tested to increase the accuracy and reliability of the information it provides. Several questions must be raised regarding the current testing process and the interpretation of the results and Breed Heritage are working hard to ensure a more productive and relevant process. Currently, Breed Heritage will use genomic data for identifying haplotypes and for some information it provides, but we cannot rely on this information to make informed breeding decisions until we believe the system is relevant to our breed.

What are the biggest challenges you must deal with?

We have a list of these! As a small breed we have a small gene pool. Genomics will identify certain genetics as superior, but a good balance of genetic selection must be prioritised, or else all genetics will be of a similar breeding! The high use of Sexed semen has and will further limit the number of bulls born for future consideration. Breeder's responses can sometimes be delayed, and reliability of information is often low. However, no challenge is

too big to get in the way with such a worthwhile project.

Are there any sires in AI because of previous Breed Heritage work?

We are proud to acknowledge our inputs have succeeded with Haresfoot Panache, Cuthill Towers Buster, Brieryside Hail, Biddesden Hector, Swaites Nickle, Gwynogg Primetime, Moathouse Monopoly, Whitecroft Panell and Grove Razell which have all come from past Breed Heritage suggested mating's.

Who are the Breed Heritage Committee?

Michael Broadley (Chairman), Colin Christophers, Peter Drummond, John Adamson, Rodney Armstrong, and Scott Taylor. It is a five-year term with one committee member retiring each year. Sam Wake from Cattle Services and the current Society president are also in attendance to our meetings. The programme is managed by Duncan Hunter from Hunter Dairy Consulting.

If there is one message to get across to Ayrshire breeders regarding the programme, what would that be?

Breeders' participation is paramount to the development and success of Breed Heritage and the breeds future prosperity. We rely on them to let us know of the animals they have for consideration. Feedback is necessary for accurate recording. We can gain access to much information but if there is an issue with a female on the programme i.e., Somatic Cell Counts or a trait weakness of negativity to the breed then honesty will help us all with future development! We must all be in this together, use the tools available to us, remember the influence of a cow family, use our eyes to see what is in front of us and above all keep breeding Ayrshire cattle!

Allocated time has been created to run the programme and we can assure you we do our very best to make it as successful as possible.

CREECH HILL FARM PARTNERSHIP

The Creech Hill prefix established in 2015 when Mervyn Walters began to purchase Ayrshire bloodlines, the foundation group was purchased from the Tinkers Park Head herd. Following this, they increased their numbers again in 2019 with a further 40 animals purchased from

day to day running of the farm, along with new herdsman Fred as Ryan maintains his love of contracting and as well as for himself helps other local contractors. Laura has been the driving force behind their recent success in the show ring, by encouraging Naomi to enter teams of calves into the local and national shows including the South West Dairy show and All Breeds Calf show. Their combined attention to detail and good routines for the show animals proved key to their success during the 2021 showing season.

Creech Hill were crowned the winners of the premier breeder award of the show season of 2021 and recipient of the Haresfoot vase at the AGM during the annual conference in Cheshire in May. "It was very emotional to find out we had won as it was our first full year of showing" Naomi said. The team achieved numerous championship placings including Champion at the South West Dairy show and Honourable mention at the ABAB Calf show along with several top three placings in classes throughout both shows.

the Swaites herd. It was after this in 2020 when Naomi and Ryan joined the partnership. Their journey has been supported by John Powrie, a close family friend who has advised and offered a steady hand whilst setting up the herd they have today.

Ayrshires were the obvious choice for Mervyn as the ground they farm in the Somerset Hills varies. They aim to breed slightly blended Ayrshires at 75% that have a bigger frame than the traditional Ayrshire that can milk well from their simple but sometimes hard grazing system. Current AI sires include Pam Ayr's Hawaiian, Ardmore Jeepers Creepers, Swaites Nickle, Swaites Dermott, Des Fleurs Saguenay along with a couple of Red and White sires.

The herd calve from July to December and graze as much as possible from March to November, however, they do buffer feed grass silage if grass stocks begin to look tight. Although yield is rising, they have planned to change their winter ration from just feeding grass and maize silage to adding an element of crimped wheat. Concentrates are fed all year round through the parlour.

Naomi's good friend, Laura Sales, works alongside the family with the



The team are looking to market their herd more by offering stock for sale as well as expanding their showing experience by attending other shows, including taking a milking team to UKDD as well as attending the other local and national shows they already support. The family are also looking forward to supporting local herd visits during the World Conference in 2024.

Naomi and Ryan attended part the conference in Cheshire for the first time this year "we felt very welcome by all society members attending despite knowing very few people, we hope to join future conferences," said Naomi.

We are sure the members join the society in congratulating the team at Creech Hill for their success and look forward to seeing them at future shows and society events.

Cheshire was the venue for the 2022 Ayrshire Cattle Society AGM and Conference, based at the stunning Rookery Hall Hotel. We could not have wished for such wonderful weather to greet us and remain throughout the Conference.

The Monday morning saw the Presidents and council meet before delegates arrived for the AGM and awards giving. Following the finance and presidents reports, it was onto the election of officers. The following officers were unanimously agreed:

President – Andrew Broadley (Whitcroft)

Vice President – John Watson (High Mark)

Junior Vice President – Rodney Armstrong (Plaskett)

Past President – Steve Bailey (Beeline)

Honorary Life President – John Hunter (Ardmore)

Although the presidents have been elected at the AGM due to COVID we extended their period in office meaning operationally new titles will not take effect until 1.1.2023. Following the AGM, the awards giving was held where we welcomed the winners of the 2021 photographic competition, Lifetime Production awards along with the Star Brood Cows. The final award to be presented was the Premier Breeder Exhibitor award. This is presented each year to the exhibitor gaining the most points for winning at qualifying shows across the country. This year, the award and Haresfoot Vase was presented to the Creech Hill Farm partnership from Somerset.

After having lunch at the hotel, the first visit on the itinerary was an industry visit to the Cogent bull stud. Here the team paraded several Ayrshire's they had on

centre along with a few Red and White Holsteins, British Blues and Angus sires. We were then given an insight into the high tec machines they use to sex the semen drawn. The group then took the very short trip down the road to the dairy unit where they milk 2600 head on a 60-point rotary milking three time a day with around 400 dry cows and 1500 followers. The milking herd are housed over six cubicle sheds with a complex system of underground pipes to carry the slurry to the separation plant, where the sand from the beds is separated and reused as more bedding whilst the slurry is pumped to a lagoon.

After lunch in Sandbach, the alternative programme visited Biddulph Old Hall where host Bryan shared his passion for the remains of the Elizabethan Manor which was once lived in by pre-Raphaelite artist Robert Bateman. The beautiful gardens and respected history told a fascinating story.

The evening meal was held at the hotel and was opened by Will Astley, Coloured breeds specialist from Cogent. The evening entertainment was a playlist made up of delegates favourite songs.

On Tuesday morning, we visited Parklands herd where we appreciated young breeder Rich's enthusiasm after bringing the former retired dairy farm back into milk production at the age of 22. With 250 head, the average yield across the hard was 8213lts per cow. We wish Rich all the very best with his farming future. The buses departed for lunch and visit to Upper Lightwood Green Farm, home of the Beeline herd. It was great to see

the impressive new system which has allowed them to increase their milking herd to 350 producing an average 8000Lts. The Beeline herd looked superb basking in the warm sun, and it was clear to see the hard work the family had put in to establish the herd.

The alternative programme went straight to Beeline to enjoy and learn the skill of silk painting. After a fantastic lunch, the group were accompanied by some of our car enthusiasts for an interesting visit to the Bentley Motor Factory. Following dinner, delegates danced the night away to the band, Live Wires.

A slightly earlier start off the blocks on Wednesday morning meant the buses were quieter than they had been! After a slightly longer journey to the first visit of the day and a few Zzz's on the way, the delegates arrived at Booth Hall Farm where Mike Norbury took the delegates to view his 200 head of milkers. The milking herd average 7800lts at 4.5% BF and 3.45% Protein. After returning from the field, Mikes father, Alan, offered delegates the chance to view his impressive collection of vintage tractors.

The second visit of the day took us to the home of Ian Patrick's Whitegate herd where the delegates tucked into a pie and pea lunch. Ian had to relocate the herd in 2014 due to landlord of the original farm getting planning permission for the land. The move came with its difficulties as the herd had to settle onto their new pastures. The herd runs on a simple system of grass, silage down the passage and concentrated in the parlour. At the time of the visit, Ian was milking 135 head averaging 7200kgs at 4.3% BF and 3.4% Protein. The





delegates were treated to ice creams from the Partington families Milk Maids parlour.

The alternative itinerary visited Tatton Park, a farm which provides a picture of rural life where time has stood still since the 1930's. The group were taken round the farm whilst being told the 'Field to Fork' story, meeting the farms characters along the way. The entertainment for the morning was the delegates trying their hand at sausage making...with some more skilled than others. Following the morning excitement, the delegates went for lunch in Knutsford before taking the afternoon to explore the many boutique shops.

The final evening welcomed the delegates, hosts, sponsors, and friends to the black tie dinner. The evening entertainment began before heading into the dining room with Basel, Sybil and Manuel showing guests to their seats. The sketch from the well known TV programme, Fawlty Towers, continued throughout the meal with various calamities in the kitchen, not to mention the teeth in the soup! 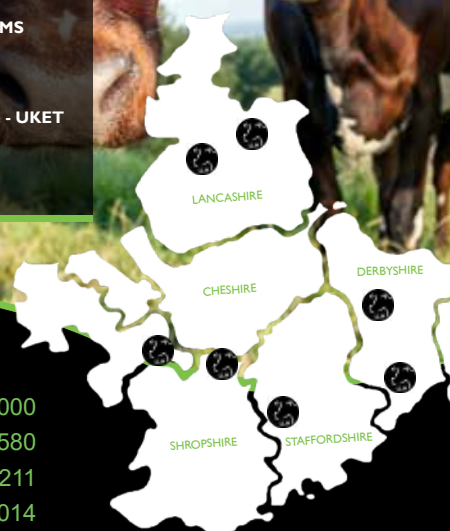

HALOTYPES;

GENETIC ABNORMALITIES

and how they affect the Ayrshire Breed by Duncan Hunter



TECHNICAL

Through DNA genotyping we see many benefits such as a higher reliability for the estimation of genetic evaluations and conformation of parentage for a more accurate recording of pedigrees within our herd book. But we also see the identification of genetic anomalies in our breed otherwise known as halotypes.

After the introduction of genomics, as a by-product of genotyping the discovery of a haplotype affecting fertility in the breed was identified and labelled as AH1 (Ayrshire Haplotype 1). A little later a second haplotype affecting fertility was discovered which is labelled as AH2 (Ayrshire Haplotype 2).

Both AH1 and AH2 reflect the expression of two different genes that are genetically recessive at some stage of embryonic or foetal development for animals that inherit a copy from both parents (homozygous carriers). The propagation of these undesirable genes in our breed occurs solely using carrier sires to carrier females and when this occurs, the resulting progeny have a 25% chance of being homozygous, leading to early embryonic death or a stillborn calf. From research undertaken in North America the results suggest that AH2 can cause early embryonic mortality whilst the effects of AH1 occur much later in the pregnancy for calves that are homozygous for the gene associated with this haplotype.

The ideal approach is to minimize the frequency that carrier sires are mated to carrier females. All carrier sires are identified with the abbreviation AH1 or AH2 after their name on our animal data system. Females can be identified through genomic testing.

More recently another recessive was identified known as AM (Arthrogryposis Multiplex) commonly known as Curley Calf syndrome. This recessive causes calves not to fully develop properly in the womb due to a lack of proteins missing which form the muscular and bone development. Affected calves will most likely be still born or will die soon after birth. They generally carry to full term and only rarely is there early embryonic death with this condition. It is not known to be related or linked to any other recessives. Calves that are born alive will be small and undernourished. The main worry

is the possibility of twisted and rigid limbs and spine. Severity of the contorted limbs will vary, but most often the calves are not able to be presented correctly in the birth canal to the extent that a C-section is necessary to extract the calf. The danger is that at the point of labour, you may not realise that you are dealing with a severely deformed calf which cannot pass through the birth canal. Obviously, the stress level to the cow can add other complications or loss.

The source of the recessive is from the overseas registered sire Peterslund 59000000091213. If Peterslund does not show in the ancestry offspring will not be affected.

Below are examples of scenarios of the recessive AM breeding:

1. A mating is between two non-carriers, (AMF) there is no problem and calves will of course be normal.
2. A mating of a carrier (AMC) sire onto a carrier (AMC) dam will be of high risk. 50% of the time the offspring will be a carrier but show no signs of the deformity. 25% of the offspring will be a non-carrier (AMF), but 25% of the time you will get an affected deformed calf.
3. A mating between a non-carrier (AMF) and a carrier (AMC), you can expect 50% of offspring to NOT carry the affected gene but 50% WILL carry the affected gene. The calves that are carriers will not show the abnormality but will be able to pass that defective gene on to their offspring.

Recessives are common and in all breeds. This recessive is particularly dangerous, but with care and sensible decisions now we can eradicate it or at least substantially lower the AMC population.

You may also see the initials FM03C or FM03A identified on your genomic report. FM03 is known as fishy gene and was first discovered in the Swedish Red breed. This results in a fishy-off flavour in milk characterized by a distinct unpleasant smell and taste. This defect is due to elevated levels of Trimethylamine (TMA) and can have a significant effect on the taste and smell of your bulk milk samples. FM03C is a carrier of the gene and FM03A is transmitter of the gene. When the gene is identified in a female you should use sires with no evidence of the gene being present. Using an FM03C sire will in most instances have no effect on a non-infected female. An FM03A should be completely avoided.

I know that you can never breed a show cow, but it is great when one turns up.

After the struggles of the past three years, it has been refreshing to have been able to put a nice selection of bulls into the catalogue. As a committee, we work hard to find the best bulls that are available and it's always great when we can get a bull onto an EU approved collection centre. This year we have been able to get the following bulls into stud: Alkmonton Stardust, Beeline Ladys Man, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, and Grove Razell. We have been very fortunate to be able to offer the bulls in SEXED ULTRA 4M straws in the past. With more advances in technology, the SEXED ULTRA straws are now available in SEXED ULTRA 4M High Purity – what makes the

new 4M High Purity different is that it presents the user the possibility of having 96% to 97% heifer calves which is a 6% rise from the SEXED ULTRA straws.

As already mentioned, we have been able to put more bulls onto stud and the latest two are: Beeline Lady's Man and Cuthill Towers Calcutta. Beeline Lady's Man is a maternal brother to Beeline Santa Rock who is one of the top bulls in the Ayrshire breed - he is sired by Palmyra Power Remsberg with his dam being Halmyre Urr Ladybird 443 who was classified EX92 (2E). Lady's Man excels in his health traits being positive for production, fat % and fertility index as well as being a minus for cell counts. Lady's Man will be a great outcross sire to use in your breeding programmes. The other new sire to be released is Cuthill Towers Calcutta; he is sired by the high type sire, Cuthill Towers Buster, out of Cuthill Towers Magenta EX93 (3E). Calcutta offers high type, production, and fat in one package.

CUTHILL TOWERS CALCUTTA

Cuthill Towers Calcutta is one of the first sires that Cattle Services have been able to offer in the new SEXED ULTRA 4M HIGH PURITY straws. Calcutta is a Cuthill Towers Buster son of Cuthill Towers Magenta

EX93 (3E), born in Scotland at the Lawrie Family's Cuthill Towers herd.

With the family being big rugby fans, Calcutta's name comes after the victory for Scotland in the Calcutta Cup against England in 2021. Despite this, Calcutta's roots are very English, with his dam being the result of a purchased embryo from the Rosehill herd in Cornwall at Colin Christopher's Conference in 2014.

The embryos that the Lawrie family purchased resulted in one heifer and three bulls. The embryos were sired by Palmyra Tri-Star Reality and the heifer was Cuthill Towers Magenta EX93 (3E) who has turned into one of the highest producing cows at Cuthill Towers. Magenta has milk records up to 13,918kg in 305 days. She is currently milking very well in her 5th lactation and recently classified EX93. A brother to Magenta is Cuthill Towers Majestic who is one of the highest 100% production bulls in the breed. Majestic is being used by the Breed Heritage programme

due to his extreme milk and high type.

The Magenta family is one of the most prominent families at Rosehill and traces back over 60 years when Colin's dad was farm manager at Treverno. They had bought the Grambla herd to start the Treverno herd for the Bickford-Smith family. Four generations later, Treverno Doble EX was sold as a calf to raise money for the 1977 Society 100th celebration. She was bought by Barry Colton - an auctioneer who then started a herd of Ayrshires under the Tordown prefix; she went to win the championship twice at Devon County Show. Having calved on the Election Day when Maggie Thatcher went into power, the family name changed from Dobles to Maggie's election, then Colin and his family purchased Maggie's Election 3 EX90 (Sired by Pant J.R) in 1987 as a 2nd calver. She went on to win the supreme champion at Stithians show 13 days after they had purchased her before taking five more interbreed championships for the family.



CUTHILL TOWERS CALCUTTA

Continuing winning prizes, her daughter Rosehill Maggie EX90 who was sired by Bankend Lord Ontario had two breed championships under her belt. She then bred Rosehill Magenta EX94 (9E) who was sired by Cuthill Towers Sir Adam who produced over 100 tonnes of milk and bred 13 daughters or sons who either classified very good or excellent. She is the dam of Cuthill Towers Magenta EX93 (3E).

Calcutta has great genomic predictions of siring cattle that are high type with fantastic production and health traits. He also carries the A2/A2 gene and is available to the Worldwide market.

There is much interest in the use of forage herbs which form part of a diverse cropping rotation. A practice which has been proven on DJL Agriculture clients' farms with great success in both animal and soil health. Herbs that are part of some of the existing leys on farm include, chicory, plantain and sainfoin. These deep rooting herbs provide an excellent resistance to drought which is becoming ever more important in today's climate. They also give anthelmintic properties to reduce the need for any wormers.

Diversity is key and variety is seen very much as the spice of life, a mix containing different forage grass species help to contain adequate levels of energy and protein as well as bringing in vital trace elements required to help improve stock performance. As part of the cropping rotation, Herbal leys are seen as an important part of a regenerative system. The agronomic advantages they give are tremendous and have allowed fertiliser usage to be reduced which has helped improve soil biology and has given plants a higher nutrient status which has been shown in the forage analysis which is taken before any feeding ration is prescribed.

With nitrogen prices at an all time high establishing nitrogen fixing plant species will help you reduce the amount of artificial nitrogen you apply. White Clovers can fix up to 280kg N/ha although on average is more likely to be 150 Kg N/ha. It suits both grazing and silage leys and can increase yields by up to 15% depending on the clover content. Red clover can produce more nitrogen available to the grass sward. Clover is best established after a crop that has reduced the nitrogen content of the soil such as cereals or brassicas. Broadcasting is a good method of establishment as it does not bury the seed as deep as drilling does. Clover can also be under sown with a cereal crop that is intended

for whole crop. To get the best from a legume crop the correct nutrition must be applied according to need following tissue testing and Sap Analysis so maximum nodulation occurs. This can be done using our in-field



testing equipment looking at the plant's cation and anion status in real time along with sending away tissue samples for analysis to create a healthy balanced plant. To discuss re seeding further please do get in touch and we shall be more than happy to assist you in the decision process.

Arable Silage or Whole crop mixtures are another ideal addition or alternative to grass or maize silage. Quick growing, these mixtures can be taken for silage in 10-12weeks from sowing or left until 14 -16weeks to be harvested as whole crop. These mixtures can act as an excellent nurse crop to an under sown grass ley although for successful grass establishment, the arable silage mixture should be harvested no later than 10-12weeks from sowing.

For those growing this crop for nutritional purposes to dairy cows, this whole crop forages provides an excellent feed with a well-balanced combination of starch and protein.

This crop produces Amino acids required in different amounts of each of the 10 essential amino acids, including: phenylalanine, valine, threonine, tryptophane, isoleucine, methionine, histidine, arginine, leucine, and lysine.

Methionine and lysine are the two most studied essential amino acids and have been shown to be limiting output of milk protein in dairy cows. The feed quality of this whole crop has been proved and backed up by forage analysis. For Feeding

advice, formulation of diets and rations please do get in touch, this is then backed by a 'hands on' presence on farm, resulting in cost effective rations that really work!

RESILIENCE IS KEY

THE BOWDEN HERD

*Farm
Feature*

The Bowden Herd is run by the Ashford family who have been farming on the foothills of Dartmoor, just outside Buckfastleigh, for three generations. Russ and Sandy have recently begun to hand the reins over to daughter Emily, who returned to the farm in November '21 since leaving to study Agriculture at Reading University, which then randomly

led to a career rowing for Great Britain, and then a short time working for the Metropolitan Police Service. She is finding that policing the streets of Brixton is quite a contrast to milking cows on Dartmoor! The Ashford's also employ Tristan Hunter as a herdsman who is very keen and skilled, and youngster Louis Norman who is new to the dairy industry and shows excellent potential.

The pedigree herd at Bowden is 90 strong and adopts an all-year-round calving system, supplying milk to OMSCo. Some of the dry cows and in-calf heifers can be found grazing the commons of Dartmoor in the Summer and Autumn months, utilising a new technology called 'NoFence' - a Norwegian brand which has developed a collar worn by livestock which creates a virtual boundary around the animal. The collar is GPS tracked and entirely solar powered. It allows farmers to graze stock in remote areas which are extremely difficult to access and monitor. This technology also reduces over-grazing and poaching and stops livestock from roaming to the other side of Dartmoor! For us, it also expands our grazing options and frees up Bowden for the milking herd.

The milking herd are fed a grass-based ration which is supplemented by home-

grown oats, peas, and some herbal leys. They are also fed cake in the parlour, calculated on yield and lactation stage. Our average yield is 6900KG with the highest yielders pushing 8000KG. A refined breeding programme aims to breed replacements from these cows, as long as they can also demonstrate resilience. This is particularly important at Bowden due to the requirement for the cows to remain outside for at least 8 months of the year, whilst being exposed to all the elements we experience at 800 feet above sea level. Resilience is also fundamental since the herd converted to 'PWAB' - produced without antibiotics. Cows must consistently adopt a low SSC to be compatible with this incentive.



Amongst the heifers, we continue to benefit from Rosehill Manderville and Hilltown Oblique daughters calving into the herd, who work very well in our system with good temperaments, reliable yields, and tidy feet and legs. We have also been very impressed by Lyner Oblique Focus and Tristar Platinum daughters who have recently joined, who are proving to be quiet in the parlour, and very milky with strong fore and rear udder attachment. Amongst the youngsters we are excited by a very promising crop of heifer calves by Jeepers Creepers who are now coming up to bulling age, demonstrating excellent vigour, robustness, and lovely conformation.



Going forward, the key areas of focus for the Bowden herd include achieving optimum herd health through a stringent breeding programme and meticulous management, improved fertility from quality forage and grazing management, and improving the efficiency of labour and resources.



We look forward to welcoming the World Ayrshire Conference here at Bowden in 2024 and we are grateful for the opportunity to show off the cows and South Devon views! Feel free to follow us on Instagram @bowdenfarmorganics in the run up to the conference.

This young cow is just so correct in so many ways, she displayed tremendous breed character and paraded to perfection on a great set of legs and feet. Senior cows saw my class leader come from the Berresford family at Heydale, this big powerful cow although very freshly calved and possibly carrying a little condition as a result, got to the top with her length of body, depth and sweep of rib and bloom in the udder.

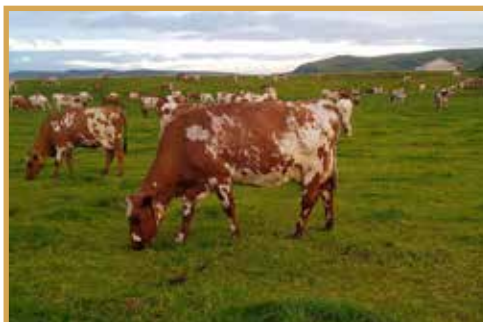

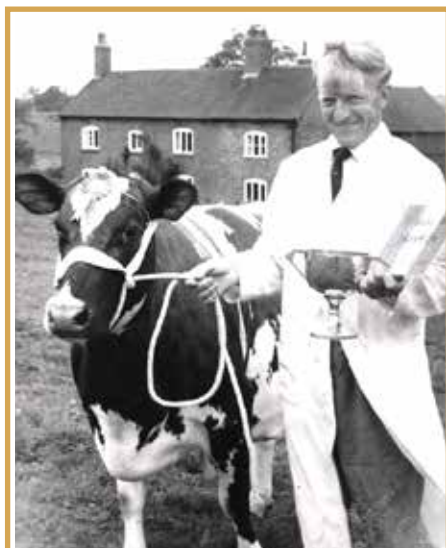

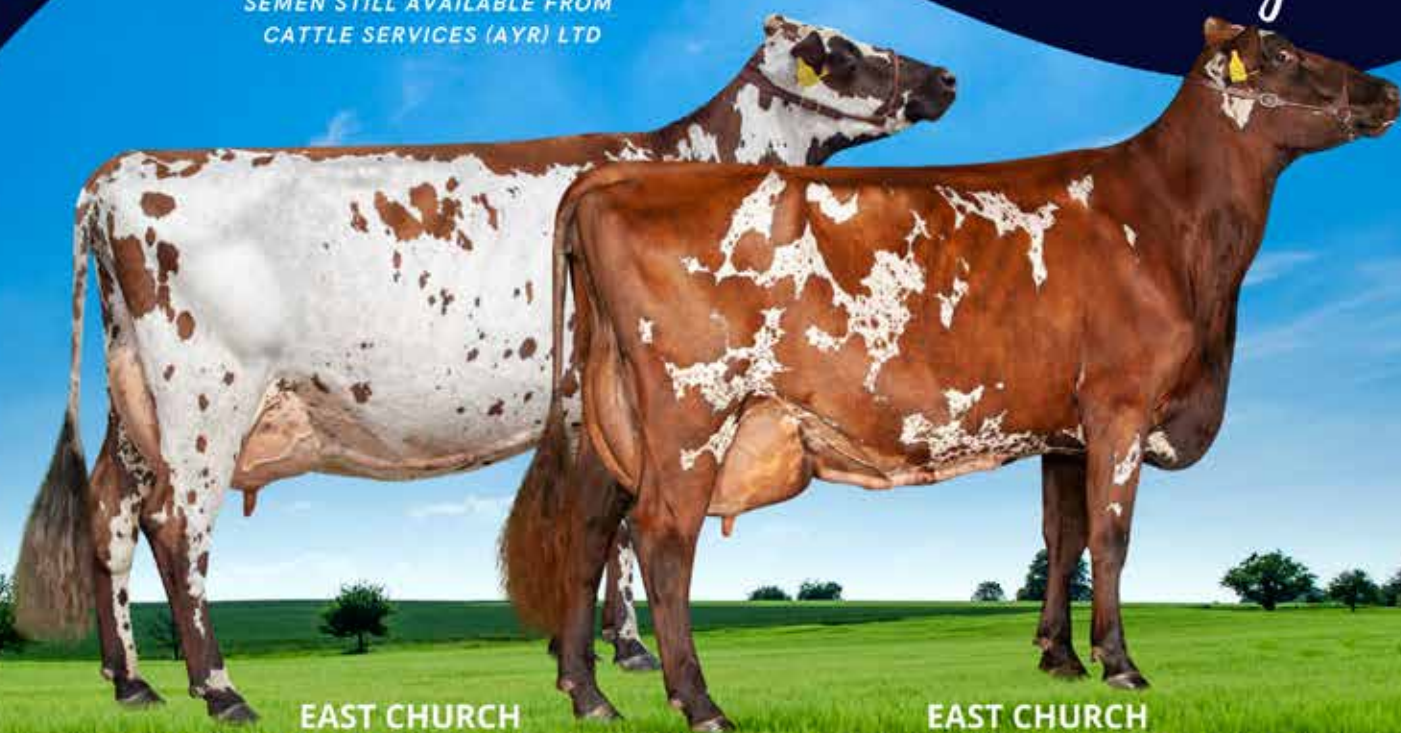

CARNELL SNOWDROP 242 ET EX92 6E LP100, SP – R Templeton

Snowdrop 242 is the 8th generation VG/EX and is sired by Lagace Modem. Her dam was the 9 Star brood cow Carnell Snowdrop 185 EX92 5E LP60.
