General Manager Claire Kimm updates membership on the activities at Head Quarters

As ever, it has been a busy few months and doesn't seem five minutes since the last journal. The new council met for the first time in November and those that wanted to took part in some basic first aid training. It was decided during the meeting that in 2023 the Society will produce two journals, this was due to an increase in print and post costs and securing commercial adverts becoming increasingly difficult. In October myself and three others from the UK travelled to the World Ayrshire Federation mid term meeting held in Madison to coincide with World Dairy Expo – a full report on this is further on in the journal. At the meeting we

asked for fundraising suggestions for the 2024 World Conference and some excellent ideas were put forward with council members supporting and pledging entries to one in particular that we will be launching in January 2023. It has been good to see many national and local shows being well supported by breeders over the last few months and we encourage anyone involved to get results to us as soon as possible so we can share through our website and Facebook page.

TYPE CLASSIFICATION SERVICE

As previously communicated on our website, Holstein UK has experienced unprecedented increases across the majority of its direct costs and the Board of Trustees have reluctantly agreed that a price increase needed to be applied from 1st November 2022. Unfortunately, the Society have no option but to pass this increase to members.

The impact of the changes is summarised below:

Flat rate fee of £122.98 for visits of 1 - 15 animals.

For visits where 16 - 100 animals are inspected - £8.21 per animal

From 101st animal to 150th animal the headage fee will reduce to £4.61 per animal

From 151st animal upwards the headage fee reduces to £3.58 per animal

Single Bull inspected alongside females - £20.00

A Classification special visit (defined as a non-scheduled visit outside the regular cycle agreed for that herd) £250.00 (to include the first 20 inspections)

Special Bull visit £122.98

Cancellation charge of less than 3 days' notice will incur a charge of £122.98

All the prices listed above are subject to VAT at the standard rate.

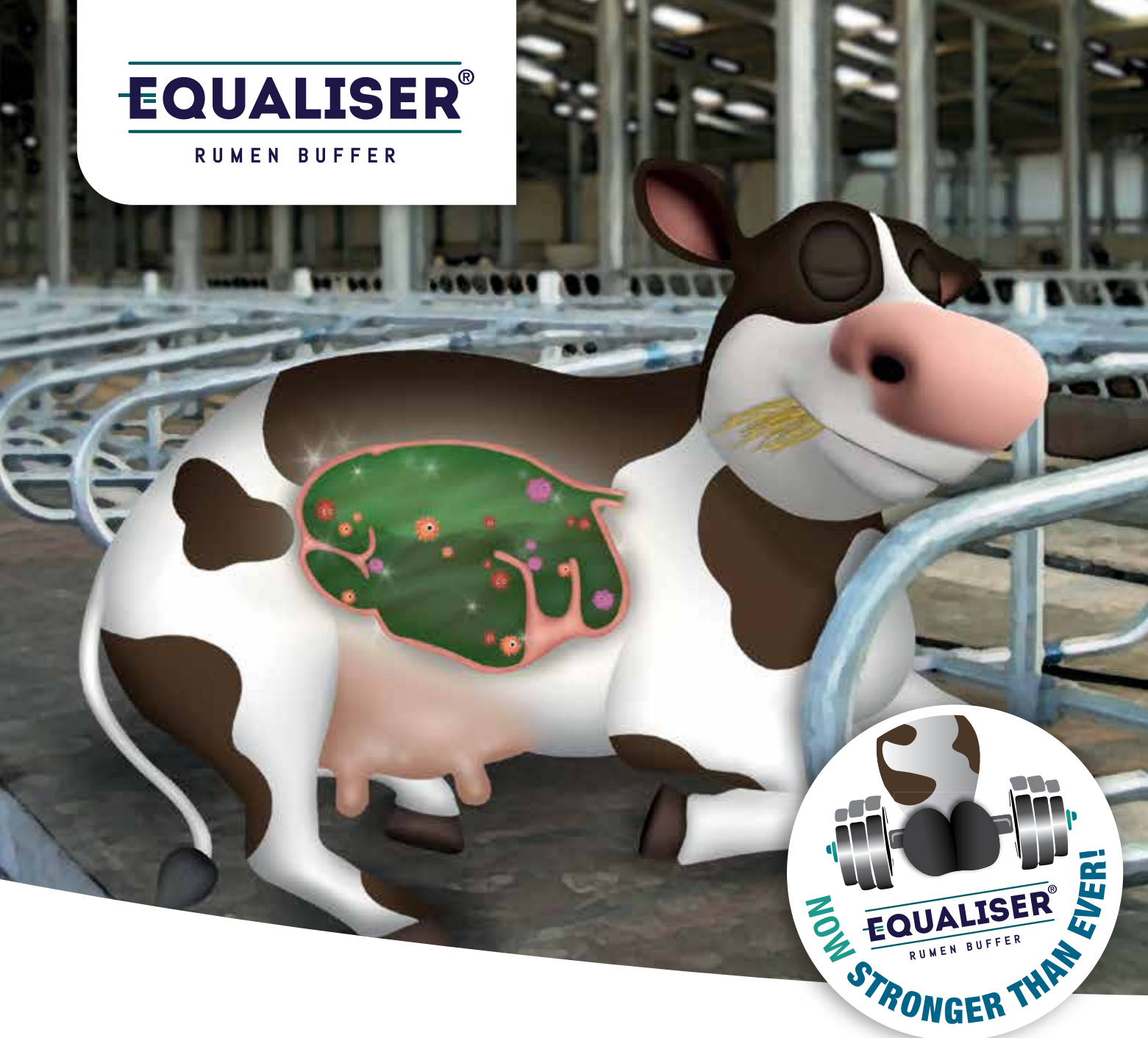

Meldale Ayrshires, Onecote Hall Farm



In a small village called Onecote which lies within the Peak District National Park, close to Leek, you will find Onecote Hall farm, home to David and Janet Mellor and their son James, his wife

Sally, and their young family. The farm consists of 172 acres which are owned plus a further 50 acres of rented land to provide for 120 milking cows plus youngstock. The farm operates a zero grazing system due to being a typically wet farm which in turn suits for an easier managed system.

Up until recently, Holsteins have featured at Onecote, however despite the best efforts of the Mellor family, the longevity and robustness of the cow required for the farm system has been unsatisfactory which has made James look elsewhere for a breed which will fulfil their criteria. James's research was focussed on strength, longevity, feed conversion and efficiency with easy management which has in turn led them to the Ayrshire breed and why he has established the Meldale Ayrshire prefix.

In 2017 the first Ayrshire semen was purchased, Amazing, Blink and Bigtime were used on the Holsteins, but with very mixed results, and on reflection maybe not the ideal genetics to use on his Holsteins. To gain ground at a faster rate the decision was made to purchase some young Ayrshire cows which were sourced from the Whitecroft, Heydale and Sandyford herds to run alongside the Holsteins. The following

year a young bull was also purchased to use on heifers, Troutbeck Flawless, a son out of well known Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3 EX96 and full brother to Troutbeck Progress. James and David are very happy with his progeny. Rosehill Vitality, Ardmore Jeepers Creepers, Heydale White Willow, Pie x Yellow and Moathouse Monopoly have been used with daughters on the ground and more recently Brieryside Hail and Pam Ayr's Hawaiian have been used extensively.

Earlier this year, a new milk contract was established where an additional requirement for high components were added. Recently used sires will stand the Meldale herd in good stead to achieve their goals being some of the best genetics available with high components. More recently a young bull was purchased from Thomas Gordon, Grove herd in Northern Ireland. Young sire, Grove Razell came straight off centre where he was being collected for marketing by Cattle Services (AYR) Ltd. Razell is from the Rosie family at Grove which need no introduction, and will no doubt fulfil the criteria for high components going forward at Onecote Hall Farm.



Currently the Ayrshires are run in a separate group from the Holsteins to monitor and record their feed intake to compare the feed efficiency and conversion of forage which James is interested in the results. Cows are fed a grass-based ration with a meal blend and topped up to yield with

dairy nuts in parlour. All heifers born are being registered with the Ayrshire Cattle Society and classifying takes place as the family have a keen interest in pedigree breeding and of course to add value to their assets. James is showing a keen interest in the breed, already showing good knowledge in cow families around the country. An interest to show at some point was detected, however as is common with many others, time and labour stands in the way. Maybe one day!

Chesil Beech Walk

Chesil Beach is no ordinary beach, it's long partly gritty stones that sink down so every step pulls the back of the leg, then larger stones that are challenging and easy to lose your footing making it a slow and tedious walk.

The fab four walked from West Bay in Dorset to Portland. The most challenging part was a stretch of eight miles that must be done all at once, taking the walkers eight hours. This stretch has the sea on one side and a lagoon on the other, no facilities and no path to the mainland! The walkers had to go prepared with food and water to be able to keep going. At one point one of our walkers lay on the stones exhausted and said "let the sea take me" he was then reminded by his fellow walkers why he was there – walking to raise funds for The Teenage Cancer Trust and the 2024 World Ayrshire Federation Conference!

Our four brave walkers – Charlotte and David Gibson, Jesse Bostock and Robert Adams did this walk over three and half days with some of the days under real hot temperatures. When talking to locals who kindly sponsored us, they said "nobody walks the stones they use the costal path"

All four finished as the sun went down. It was hard and a challenge but an amazing achievement by all four of our walkers. Well done to them, we are all very proud of you and have raised an outstanding £2762 to be split between The Teenage Cancer Trust and the 2024 World Ayrshire Federation Conference!

BREED HERITAGE UPDATE

Alongside the existing Breed Heritage programme which identifies and works with cow families, steering them in the direction to be bull mothers and enhancing the purity of the breed, the committee have developed a new initiative to expand the breeds genetic pool in the UK. This will be identified as the “Ayrshire genetic expansion project”. We believe it is imperative to attempt to expand the gene pool of the breed as soon as possible.

As a small breed we see an ever-decreasing pool of genetics available to UK Breeders. There are obvious reasons for this: High usage of sexed semen, genotyped genetic predictions are promoting the same bloodlines and the infusion of outside blood into the Ayrshire breed all have and will continue to contribute to the reduction of our available genetic pool.

If we can add some alternative bloodlines to our gene pool, we will see an expansion of outside bloodlines available which in turn will benefit Ayrshire Breeders in the UK and offer a wider range of available genetics in the future for Cattle Services (AYR) Ltd to market.

OUR AIM

Firstly, we are attempting to locate semen already available from on farm collections which is stored in approved facilities, and which may be available for use within our project. But the main aim of this project is to identify current on farm bulls and monitor all future registered males which are of outcross genetics for potential on farm conventional semen collection. This will be prioritised on the mainland as any semen collection for commercial distribution in Northern Ireland must be collected in approved facilities. The criteria for selection is simple:

- Only pure bloodlines
- Outcross bloodlines as a priority
- Bred from cow families ideally outperforming their herd mates

HOW WILL IT WORK?

Once a sire is selected and agreed by the committee an application for relevant licences and an appointment of an approved service provider will be implemented.



Only one jump will be required where anything up to 400 doses may be collected. We are aware it could be considerably less and will work with the results accordingly.

Breed Heritage will use some of the product produced for future work on the programme and the remainder will be offered for sale to interested breeders, and an allocation to be retained by the breeder of the bull. Assistance from Cattle Services (AYR) Ltd has been agreed to help us with the licence applications, storage, and delivery of the product.

The initial funding for this project will come from budgeted Breed Heritage funds. However, we believe we can deliver this project to be self-funding in the future.

We see this as a project which must be prioritised for the future of the UK Ayrshire. We are aware that only small amounts of conventional semen are used, but it is still being used and will continue to do so as males are required for our breeds future. Outcross genetics will provide our members with more choice in the future. There will always be challenges with the biggest being identifying potential candidates, and we are aware of this.

We all have the responsibility to protect and enhance the breed, and the Breed Heritage committee are united with their belief that we should take a lead. Our work requires the help and cooperation from breeders providing us with information and working with us to secure our options for future breeding.

We want to hear from you if you can help our cause by informing us of any male calf born on your holding with pure genetics, which is of outcross bloodlines to today's popular bloodlines and from a family you have belief in. Please contact the Breed Heritage Manager, Duncan Hunter.

National Ayrshire Show 2022

held at UK Dairy Day

The National Ayrshire show was again held at UK Dairy Day where we are lucky to have the best facilities and platform to promote the breed to the fore. Breeders travelled far and wide to support the show and exhibit their stock. Several Ayrshire Young Breeders were again in attendance to provide help and skills to those who requested it. This year we were very honoured to welcome Lynn Lee from the USA as our judge.

Quality was on offer throughout every class from the Ayrshire breed for the crowds to admire. The day began with the heifers split into Juniors and Seniors. Heydale Progress Elaine took the win in the Junior section for DW Berresford & Son. She is

sired by Troutbeck Progress and extends from the famous Bronara family from the USA. The Firm of DM Lindsay won the Senior class with Mid Ascog Patricia 3. This recent purchase by the Lindsay's, all the way from the Isle of Bute is a Bruchag Starman daughter.

Judge Lynn Lee selected his Senior winner, Mid Ascog Patricia 3 to go on to take the heifer championship. She was described by the judge as the most correct and balanced heifer in the show. The second placed Senior heifer Bigginvale Mark Marie 18 from RT & JI Adams was awarded Reserve heifer champion.





The Junior cow class was the strongest entry of the day with a tremendous show of young cows. John Smith was tapped out into first place with Wigboro Wick Triclo Helena 2 VG86. The judge commented on her dairy quality and clean lines. Helena 2 is by Sandyford Triclo and produced an impressive 10,546 kgs as two year old. Second place was Holmeswood El Clover VG87 from A Rimmer. This young cow is the third generation on from the famous Sandyford Clover 10 EX97 8E and is sired by Sandyford Elvis. The Crawford family's Longwood Vicking Barbara was pulled into third in this very competitive class.

In the Intermediate class first prize was taken by young member Adam Lindsay with Middle Jean CHTD 3, by Cuthill Towers Highland Dream. Lynn Lee commented on the strength and overall capacity which gave her the advantage over Bigginvale Mark Marie 14 from RT & JI Adams in second.

M A Howie exhibited Morwick Reality Emerald EX93 and was the winner of the Senior cow class for her overall balance and bone quality as described by judge Lynn Lee. Emerald is by West Mossgiel Modern Reality and extends back to the Emerald family from Bonnie Brae in Canada. Harperfield Queen Elizabeth 2 EX92 by the home bred sire Harperfield Sands of Time was pulled out in second from the Firm of DM Lindsay.

There were two classes for animals in the Society's Red and White section. This year's heifer class was won by Stevenson's Bunt 178 from Messrs Howie & Stevenson and the winning cow was West Mossgiel Mayflower 224 EX94 3E from GG Baynes & Son.

Always one of the highlights of the National Show is the breeders' groups. Our Judge, Lynn Lee chose the group from the Firm of DM Lindsay as the winner and recipient of the Gordon Timbrell memorial trophy with the Bigginvale entry from RT & JI Adams in second.





The championship line-up was a credit to the Ayrshire breeds exhibitors' efforts and success throughout the day. Lynn Lee selected his senior cow winner Morwick Reality Emerald EX93 as his National Show Champion with the Junior cow winner Wigboro Wick Triclo Helena 3 VG86 taking Reserve Champion and the second prize Junior cow Holmeswood El Clover VG87 as Honourable Mention.

The winners of the 2022 Premier Exhibitor of the National show and recipient of the Chris Window memorial trophy was the Firm of DM Lindsay, Harperfield.

After the show, Lynn had a trip to the Hunnington, Alkington, Bigginvale and Whitecroft herds whilst enjoying the Derbyshire countryside and an FA Cup derby tie of Buxton versus Alfreton. Thanks must go to the Adams and Broadley families for hosting Lynn for the second part of his trip to the UK.

UK Dairy Day returns to the International Centre, Telford on Wednesday 13th September 2023.



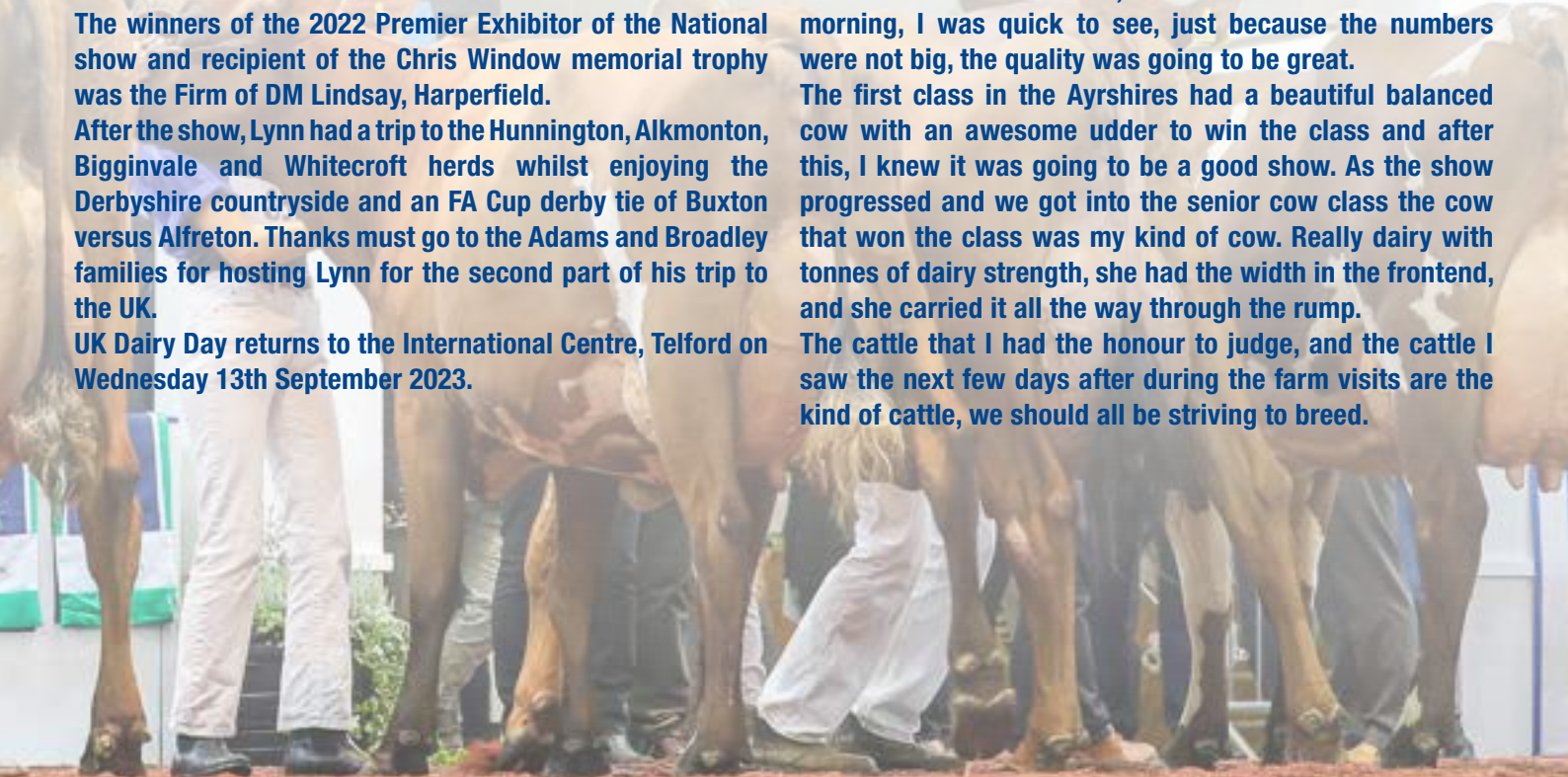
A word from judge, Lynn Lee.

WELCOME TO HARPERFIELD

FARM FEATURE

The Lindsay family farm at Harperfield Farm, Sandilands near Lanark and have done since the herd was established in 1946. For a long time, they managed two farms, Harperfield and Metal Bridge at Gretna. Metal Bridge was the milking unit, and Harperfield was where all the youngstock were reared.

In 2012, Rodgers Uncle Euan passed away, and through no fault of their own, Metal Bridge was taken away from the family and with it, they lost the full milking herd.

The decision was taken to calve the handful of in calf heifers and dry cows that were at Harperfield, and this would become the milking herd. Barr Sandy Rose 56 was one of the cows taking her dry period at the time the family lost Metal Bridge. Soon to be the foundation cow for the current milking herd, she calved a bull calf, Harperfield Sands of Time. He was then used as the stock bull and sired 32 heifers and two registered males, including Harperfield Wind in the Willows.

Barr Sandy Rose 56 has recently achieved her LP100 in ten lactations with her current lactation taking her to over 109,000

acres the family farm are exceptionally dry. This allows the milking cows to graze a longer season, and youngstock to be out all year round. Rodger is hopeful the milkers will graze until late November this season but hopes to extend this in future years by planting crops such as kale. He believes the long grazing season and low input system is the reason to having exceptional fertility.

Team Harperfield have had a great showing season, attending a whopping nine shows both locally and nationally where they have won numerous breed and interbreed titles including Champion at Moffat and Interbreed Champion at Newmilns show with Harperfield Peach 57 and the Interbreed group of three at Strathaven show. "We would have gone to more shows if we had the time, we just love showing our cows" says Rodger.

During their busy showing season, Bill was invited to judge Bute show. This is when the Bruchag Starman daughter, Mid Ascog Patricia 3 caught his eye. Shortly after the show, she was purchased from breeders Charles and Jackie McAllister and added to the team to head down to the National show at UK Dairy Day. After winning the senior heifer class and taking best udder, she then went on to take Heifer Champion, "this was a real achievement, we have never won the Heifer Championship at the national show before" Rodger added.

Kerr Lindsay along with young members Adam and Stuart Lindsay are part of the Harperfield showing team and we hope to see their success continue. Congratulations once again to the Lindsay Family on their successful show season and awards at the National Ayrshire Show.

LIFELONG LOVE FOR AYRSHIRES

INTERNATIONAL
FEATURE

As a child Gordon discovered a passion for the Ayrshire, even though his father had a predominately Jersey herd. That passion never went and eventually led to him starting the Sanrosa Ayrshire stud more than 40 years ago.

Gordon, his partner Bethany, and son Jonathan milk 270-275 cows on 120 hectares at Riverlea. The stud was established in 1977 and Gordon is two-time president of Ayrshire New Zealand and has chaired its marketing arm, Semayr Breeding Services, for more than 20 years. He is a senior judge and traits other than production (TOP) Inspector.

They milk 25 Friesian cows as a direct comparison to his Ayrshires. They are bred to the best genetics and farmed in the same conditions. He also milks four Jerseys just for something a little different.

When I was a kid I used to fill out my dad's AI book. You wrote down A, J or F for the bull breed. Some days I had put an 'A' down instead of 'J' for the breed of sire. So, we ended up with some half Jersey, half Ayrshire calves, Gordon says.

My dad did not seem to mind. When he began herd testing he discovered that they were the top producing cows. With that hybrid vigour, they should have been too. Dad then began using more Ayrshire genetics. The use of Finnish genetics has enabled his herd to gain approximately 100kg MS per cow. They are now producing over 1kg MS/kg of bodyweight.

In the 2020-21 season the Sanrosa Ayrshire herd averaged 8707 litres of milk, 376 kilograms of fat and 325kg protein (701kg MS) in 295 days from 215 cows. This record smashed the previous breed record of 639kg MS from the same herd in the preceding season and this is the third season in a row the herd has produced a new

breed record. This record will see them receive the Mayfield Trophy for NZ's top producing Ayrshire herd 23 times since the 1986-87 season.



The herd receives a mineral supplement through the in shed feed and are fed 1.2kg per milking of 40% DDG; the remainder consists of wheat bran, pellets, and little soya hull in shed per milking. Whatever mix they start the season with, is what they finish it with – they do not usually alter quantities. But in March Fonterra announced an even higher milk price and the amount was upped to 1.5kg.

I can remember my father saying that very good cows produce 18-20 litres per day. Now we have heifers producing well over thirty litres per day, and our top cows are doing around 50. Calving starts early August, and they keep 50-60 replacements which are fed twice-a-day for 100 days and receive eight to nine litres of milk each per day. For the first month only fresh colostrum is fed, never stored colostrum. During the last two years some milk powder has been used when they get short of milk. The calves are started on meal at one month old and are not weaned until they are 12 weeks old. Any that look a bit small are held back.

The farm always has a good run of heifer calves. A couple of years ago they had 85 and thought of it as a bad year. The herd is at a stage now where they are happy to keep a calf from any cow.

We keep every heifer calf if it's from an Ayrshire bull, which gives us far too many. This year we had one hundred heifer calves and sold the extra calves at our on farm sale. The sale of those premium calves is a welcome boost of income. People tend to buy their Ayrshire bull calves for harder country, where they



fossick better than most breeds. Some bull calves are sold for service bulls or for future use in the AI industry.

Mating begins on October 28 and continues until early January, lasting for eight weeks. No CIDRs or vet interventions are used. "We just take it as they come."

Gordon's goal has always been to breed his herd to produce well and to have a high standard of conformation. Being a TOP assessor helps him evaluate his herd. Gordon does not focus on the amount of milk solids the herd produces over the season. And he does not know what last year's production was. If someone asked him what his top cows produce, he could not tell them. But he intensely watches the bottom ones. "The top cows take care of themselves," I use what I consider to be the best New Zealand and international genetics. Even though the international genetics conversions may not rank well, you need to compare them from their country of origin.

For this season's mating he has used a top bull called IWA Super Sonic. That bull has been used on over half of the herd; the rest were mated to a complete outcross of a Scandinavian bull called Vimo.

We put every unrelated cow to the New Zealand bull and the rest to the Scandinavian bull. It is easier to keep it 'clean' when you do that, rather than bits and pieces from multiple bulls, he says.

He uses a selection of NZ's best ranked bulls. One bull that has done well is one that he bred, Sanrosa Deacon. Gordon puts great emphasis on the breeding values of fat and protein. He enjoys the bull selection process and has often travelled overseas to view bulls. His aim is to pick a bull that is consistent on all traits. He has discovered that if he breeds for individual traits, he might improve that particular trait, but others begin to slip.

"Our first trait is production. The second trait is a standard of conformation that will handle that production and be better than the average animal,"

They use Scandinavian bulls that are positive in every trait and believe they could not have achieved their current production without those genetics. Before genomics were implemented, Finland alone proved 110-120 Ayrshire bulls per year, which is similar to the number of Friesian bulls proven annually in NZ.

Ayrshires remain an interest for Gordon and he can vividly remember when his family got their first Ayrshire cow. I do not know what inspired me to like them. It is a personal preference that I can't really put my finger on. Recently my mother gave me my childhood scrapbook. It is full of cow pictures that I had clipped from the Straight Furrow's back pages. There were all sorts of cattle in it, even beef animals.

It was Edward Wake, Isla Davidson, Seth Yates, Kyle Scott, Annabelle Tomlinson, Logan Hendrie, Enfys Wheeler, Max Bryson, Adam Montgomerie and Amy Armstrong who took the top Ayrshire places within some very tough classes. In the Championship, it was Max Bryson who was tapped out as Champion, followed by Kyle Scott in Reserve and Seth Yates taking Honourable mention. Congratulations to everyone who took part.

Stuart Williams was back in the ring again this year to judge the calf classes after being the colour breed showmanship judge last year. 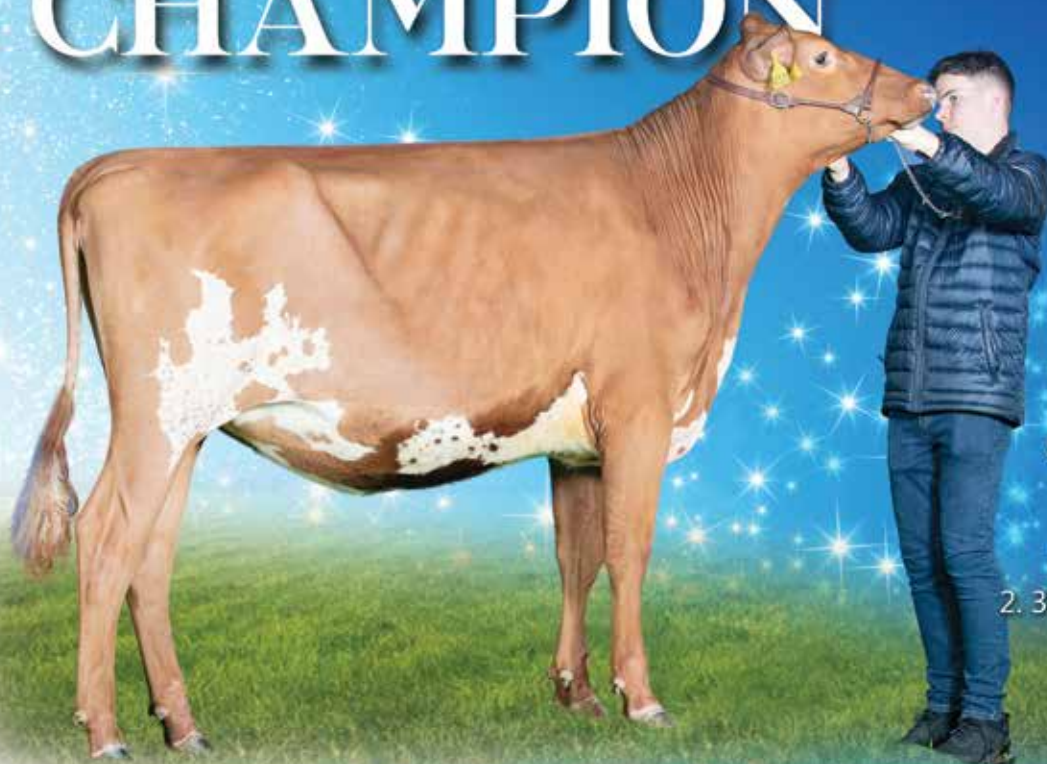

THE JULIA FAMILY FROM ELLERTON

LOOKING BACK

Holehouse White Julia, born in 1941, sired by Nether Craig Dress Parade, was bred by the Woodburn's of Holehouse. Her dam was a Bargower Blue Ribbon daughter, Holehouse Julia 4th, who had been in the winning Bledisloe Cup team at the London Dairy Show in 1932.

She was offered in WH Slater's fifth annual draft sale, as was Bargower Caledonia, in November 1943. White

Julia 400gns, and Caledonia 600gns. Both were purchased by Howard's late father, on behalf of Miss E Bassett's Ashover Herd in Derbyshire.

White Julia made her way to the late George Dodd's Ellerton herd in 1945. Her heifer stirk sired by Bargower Caledonia was the first of the Brown Julia's.

Both the White and Brown Julia's proved to be tremendous families, winning several awards for both production, and inspection. They were successful in the show ring at numerous shows including the Royal Show, London Dairy Show, Royal Highland Show, Scottish Dairy Show, and the Royal Welsh, along with several county shows.

Heifers and bulls from the Brown and White Julia families were offered for sale at the Annual Draft Sales. At the time of the Ellerton Home Sale of 1975, there had been some 208 White Julia's.

In 1992 at the Ellerton Dispersal Sale, of the 215 females on offer, no fewer than 40 were Brown or White Julia's. The families continue to breed on at Bigginvale and Calderglen.

Calderglen White Julia 14th descends 7 generations down the line from the original Lot 168 - Ellerton White Julia 312, purchased by the Barr's at the Ellerton Dispersal Sale in August 1992.

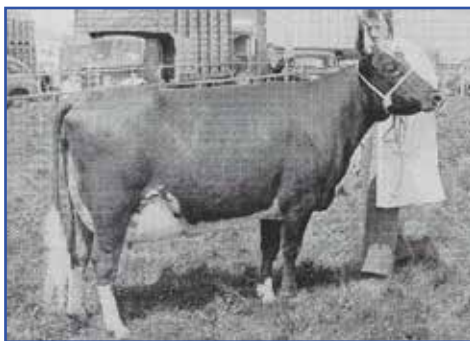
There have been over 80 White Julia's registered at the Adams family's Bigginvale Herd. They are a great family for longevity. At the Society's judging seminar held at Bigginvale earlier this year, a White Julia came to the fore, and she was also competing at UK Dairy Day.

The six photos are just a small selection I've chosen from several photographs of the Julia family. The much missed Peter with his tremendous knowledge of pedigrees is on the halter of Julia 174, and a youthful looking Frank, now in his 94th year, is on the halter of Julia 6th.

"Time flies when you are having fun" is certainly our motto for this year.

Sales for 2022 have already improved on 2021 figures including SEXED ULTRA straw sales increasing from 36% to 49% of all sales. It has also been very promising to see UK genetics continuing to be in demand across the World. In 2022, semen has been sent to Canada, Sweden, Republic of

Ireland, Australia, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Tanzania and Kenya which is great for the Ayrshire breed in the UK, and great for the breeders of these fantastic bulls, as it gets their prefixes into the worldwide market.

The other refreshing thing to note is that there is a mix of different bulls exported including: Alkmonton Stardust, Ardmore Crown Napier, Brieryside Hail, Beechmount Magic Mike, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Hunnington Fantasy, Harperfield Wind in the Willows, Moathouse Monopoly and Hunnington Famous. This demonstrates the great diversity that the breed has to offer and shows it suits different farming systems and climates on a global scale.

Currently, Cattle Services has its largest selection of bulls available in SEXED ULTRA 4M and SEXED ULTRA 4M HIGH PURITY. These include: Alkmonton Stardust, Beechmount Magic Mike, Brieryside Hail (Limited Availability), Beeline Lady's Man, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Hunnington Fantasy, Harperfield Wind in the Willows, Grove Razell and Royal Flush Sea King. Alongside these sexed bulls, there are lots of conventional straws from both old and new sires to use within your breeding programmes.

As always, Cattle Services are on the lookout for new bulls to add to our line up and this continues to be a challenge with the past six months being harder than ever. The last four bulls who were identified to go into centre for collection have all failed due to a variety of health issues. The other major obstacle is that breeders use sexed semen on their best cows so of course, not as many Ayrshire bull calves are being born on farm. To address this, Cattle Services have been identifying potential bull mothers alongside the Breed Heritage

programme to breed with conventional straws with the view to having a bull calf, although this usually has the opposite affect and leaves the farmer with a nice heifer calf!

If you have that special cow that you think is a potential bull dam or a great bull calf that has been born, please contact us as we are always on the lookout for more.

Two questions I always get asked are: What bulls are you selling the most? What animals are looking good? In response to these questions, the top five selling bulls in 2022 are: Brieryside

Hail, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Grove Razell, Hunnington Fantasy and Beechmount Magic Mike. Out on farms, the Cuthill Towers Buster daughters continue to impress me with their balanced frames, great feet and legs and superb well attached udders that are high in the rear udder and blend into the body in the fore udder. In the mature cows, the East Church Patrolman's look great - they develop with age and have great deep open frames with youthful udders. In the heifer and calf pens, the standout calves are the Hunnington Fantasy calves who are strong upstanding animals with width throughout. Furthermore, one of the highest selling bulls is Pam Ayr's Hawaiian whose daughters impress in every age group and are now starting to calve in with great udders.

As I travelled up to York for the Young Breeders weekend back in April, I never could have imagined what could come of it. After somehow winning the Hugh Stevenson award, I was offered a weeks trip to World Dairy Expo. I was then

It was a pleasure to work with such an exceptional herd of cows. The quality of the udders throughout the entire herd was one of the best I have ever seen with fantastic legs and feet also found throughout.

Some of the sires whose daughters particularly stood out were Libby's Lochinvar who has left exceptional mature cows with amazing dairy frames, fancy udders and width throughout.

contacted by Palmyra Farms who offered me the opportunity to not only work with them at expo but spend some time at Palmyra.

I set off from Manchester airport the weekend after dairy day without checking the weather in America thinking it would be the same as home (cold and wet). After a mad dash through the airport, I arrived in Washington DC to 30-degree heat wishing I had packed more appropriately. I was met at by Mike and Mary Creek who I stayed with for the duration, and I could not have asked for better hosts.

I arrived at Palmyra, a beautiful 300 acre farm set in rolling Maryland countryside. The Palmyra herd is absolutely exceptional with excellent cows everywhere you turn. The milking herd runs at around 100 and consists of roughly 60 Ayrshires carrying the Palmyra prefix and a further 40 head of all breeds. The cows are fed fresh TMR maize silage twice daily and have access to grazing 365 days of the year. The rolling herd average is 10,100 kg at 4% fat and 3.1% protein with the Ayrshires slightly outperforming their herd mates with an average of 10,160kg at 4.1% fat and 3.2% protein.

Lochinvar is the sire of an exciting young bull Palmyra Lochinvar Reynolds whose dam is the one and only Palmyra Berkley Ruth. He is certainly an interesting future prospect. Young daughters of Aravlew Orlando-P are on the ground and look to have plenty of length and stretch. Orlando is also 100% and polled. Working with the polled gene could be interesting looking into the future. Margot Calimero has left some superb senior cows. Two Palmyra bulls that are currently leaving their mark are Palmyra Bendig Roush ET and Palmyra Raven Benevola ET. Both have milking daughters with fantastic frames, legs and stylish udders.

After settling in at Palmyra it was off to Madison for WDE. This was only a short 13 hour drive which included a change in timezone! What a fantastic experience with the size of the whole show difficult to comprehend. There were 2663 cattle on site with 289 Ayrshires shown. The quality was exceptionally high throughout all the classes. Seven cows travelled from Palmyra and joined 18 heifers from interstate heifer care which led to a

long week of showing 25 animals with cows or heifers shown everyday of the show. 18 of the 25 in the string placed in the top ten of their classes with highlights being reserve junior Ayrshire champion with Stylin R Morticia (Reagan). Second in the Sr 2 with Palmyra Lochinvar B Ribbon ET who stood second to her full sister. Third in the four year old class was Palmyra Reagan R Gigi EX91, this class was the best class of Ayrshire cows I have ever seen with Palmyra Predator B Ruthless ET winning the class and going on to win Grand Champion. Other standouts from the show were winning Sr 3 and reserve champion Heineman Reagan Roz. The quality of the calves in the heifer show was phenomenal. The eventual champion Lazy M Kingsire Xyllvi was a worthy winner with a fantastic frame and clean cut. She is one of many quality calves currently on the ground by Bear-Ayr Distinct Kingsire.

After WDE, I stayed with the Creeks for further two weeks before flying down to Louisville, Kentucky for the Ayrshire show at NAILE where I met Alan Timbrell and John Watson. A full report of our time at NAILE can be found elsewhere in the journal.

After a fantastic few days in Louisville we travelled back up to Washington DC on a tour organised by US Ayrshires, on which we saw some fantastic Ayrshire herds that were a credit to the breeders. UK JUDGES CHOICE AT LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY

Alan Timbrell reports on his judging assignment.

INTERNATIONAL ASSIGNMENT

On the 4th of November John Watson and I left Heathrow airport bound for Louisville as I had been asked to judge the Ayrshires at the North American International Livestock Exhibition in Louisville, Kentucky. Three flights later, we arrived at the show where the Dairy Shorthorns and

the Red Holsteins were being judged. The quality on show gave us an insight of what was to come in the Ayrshire classes the following day.

Having just under 50 in-milk Ayrshires to judge, standing in the middle of the ring felt like a dream. The first class was for heifers that had calved under 2yrs of age. Taking first place was Toppglen Wicked Champ, a truly outstanding individual that went on to take the reserve intermediate champion title. She was by Cedarcut Colata's Champion and out of the soon to be Grand Champion Toppglen Wishful Thinking EX94. The intermediate Champion came from the junior 3yr old class, Hawver-Crest Adventure by De La Plaine Vicking-ET and the Honorable mention intermediate champion was the senior 2yr old class and she was Chaluka Burdette Xana-ET by Palmyra Tri-Star Burdette.

The Senior classes saw the champion come from the six years and over class, nine-year-old, seventh calver Toppglen Wishful Thinking EX94. This cow had everything for me, great bone quality, superb legs and feet with a high-quality udder and looked ever so youthful for a 7th

calver. Reserve was the 4yr old first place Haynes-Farm Dazzle Banshee EX93 by Family-Af-Ayr Reality Dazzle-ET and Honorable mention was the 5yr old class winner Miss Bikini of lowayside by Jostcacreage Kal Gibb Twister.

Grand Champion was Toppglen Wishful Thinking EX94 Reserve Grand Champion was Haynes-Farm Dazzle Banshee EX93 Honorable mention Grand Champion was Hawver-Crest Adventure

The second day of judging saw another outstanding display of calves and junior heifers with nearly 80 head forward. The biggest class of the day was the fall heifers with 23 entries.



The Champion came from the summer yearling class, Old-Bankston AL Wideopen by Forever Schoon Perfecter out of the full sister to Toppglen Wishful Thinking, the Senior Grand Champion. Reserve champion was Lazy M Kingsire Xyllvi by Bear-Ayr Distinct Kingsire from the fall class and the 2nd placed calf in this class was also the HM who was Shocking Burdette Apple ET by Palmyra Tri-Star Burdette.

Kivells & Norton & Brooksbank joined forces on farm in Staffordshire to disperse 440 head of Pedigree Holstein, Ayrshire & Jersey Dairy Cattle on behalf of the Bostock family. This Sale was held in very short notice and within just two weeks a catalogue was produced, and the sale was staged in front of a huge crowd of buyers with a good contingent from the depths of Devon and Cornwall with others from South Wales, Lancashire, Shropshire, Cheshire, and many local buyers as well as a strong Irish support on MartEye with 119 head making their way to Northern Ireland.

Trade far exceeded expectations, which really proved the strength of having the sale on farm and the ability to export. There were 37 milkers over £2000 across all breeds. The best of the Ayrshires topped at 2250gns for "Sunrise Supreme Evette GP84" a daughter of Sandyford Supreme, she sold fresh in September with her second to Stuart Ford of Crewe who also bought "Sunrise Polly Realisation" another second calver fresh in August.

This Guimond Yankee bred young cow is the successive 7th Generation of VG or EX cows with her 3rd Dam being the well known Barr Ranger Lottie EX95 3E. The successful purchase was made by Adam and Caroline Montgomerie to join their Lessnessock herd in Cumnock, Ayrshire in a joint ownership with J & A Struthers, Boylston Farm, Cumnock. Adam and Caroline were one of the largest volume buyers of the day purchasing a great group of all ages throughout the day which also included the Grand Dam of Yankee Lady Lottie, Galaxy Durham Lottie Red ET EX94 3E for 2000gns.

Travelling to County Tyrone in Northern Ireland was Rhos Beaumont Ovoid, a powerful stylish heifer, she was sired by Longwood Beaumont (Remington x Ranger) and from the Ovoid family originating at Heydale. Alan Irwin made this purchase for his Denamona herd for 4000gns.

It was the Dam of the day's top price who held the next highest price of 3150gns. Looking superb was Rhos Napier Lady EX92 by Ardmore Crown Napier, bred to Brieryside Hail and sold expecting her 7th calf. She joins the Sandyford herd in Loughborough for ET Tomlinson & Son.

WRC & JE Christophers purchased a wonderful group of young cows and heifers throughout the day for their Rosehill herd near Truro in Cornwall. TYPE CLASSIFICATION

and why it's a fundamental part of breeding.

TECHNICAL ARTICLE

Type Classification provides an assessment of cows in your herd reviewing the strengths and weaknesses to enhance longevity, health, and welfare. The assessment involves the measurement of 24 individual traits on a scale of 1-9, describing the degree of the trait rather than its desirability. See Table 1.

Classification involves the appraisal of an animal in comparison to the ideal. An overall score and grade are awarded, according to the following scale:

A similar score and grade are awarded to each of the five areas of the cow identified in the above graph. The final score is calculated from the individual score of these five assessments.

Type classification is an area where, as a breed we can all benefit from every inspection. For the breeder it can substantially increase the value of your cows and heifers and create information which benefits everyone. From the breeds perspective the type classification information gained on each animal is used for UK bull proofs and evaluations.

More classified daughters provides us with greater reliability of information we have on the type within our breed.

Here we have collated some data of results from Ayrshire heifers who were type classified between 2017 and 2021.

Over the last few years, we have seen a consistent trend of classification results for Ayrshire heifers with a very similar percentage of animals falling within each grade. We have seen a slight decline in total numbers classified, however in 2022, numbers are expected to be back to the levels of 2017. We would like to encourage more breeders to score their heifers and ensure ALL heifers are inspected. The table below highlights the number of animals scored in 2021 and in which category they fall.

The South West Scotland Dairy Show attracted a large crowd of people to see a great display of local dairy cattle and young handlers judged by David Wright from Berryholme Holsteins, Kendall.

Kicking off the evening and winning the junior young handlers was six year old Isla Davidson from Halmyre, leading her Ayrshire calf Halmyre Urr Scorpio 9.

Reserve champion was Tom Baynes leading his own Ayrshire calf Parkhead Brenda, she also stood first out of fourteen junior calves. This February 2022 born Cuthill Towers Bandit daughter was bred by Kevin Tinker.

Remembering Ronnie Irwin

Ronnie was born on 24th October 1950 and raised at Ballygelagh and then Roselick. Ronnie had two sisters, Ann, and the late Rosemary. He attended Portstewart primary school. Ronnie went on to Coleraine Technical College where he continued his academic journey to A-Levels. Following this, he went on to spend three years at Loughery college of Agriculture and food technology.

He returned to the family farm to run Craigtown Ayrshires, as well as sheep, cereals, and potatoes.

Ronnie's life revolved around farming with his wife, Elaine. They married on 29th September 2000. They initially set up home at Roselick before subsequently moving down the lane to Craigtown. There, they teamed together, managing all the responsibilities of farming, and maintaining Ronnie's lifelong interest in Ayrshire cows. Ronnie had a favourite cow along the way, Craigtown Flossie 6 and the rosettes and awards were a record of his prowess with Ayrshires.

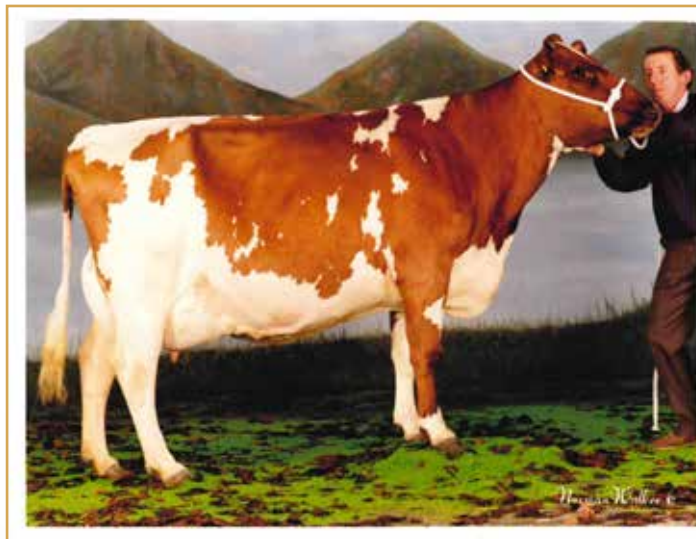
He was meticulous in his care and preparation for shows, whether at Coleraine, Ballymoney, Ballymena, Antrim, Omagh, Clogher and the Royal Winter fair. The winter fair was an annual pilgrimage and his hotel bed ended up being bedded down on the straw with the cows.

Ronnie had been an active member of the Ulster Ayrshire cattle club for many years and served on committee. He enjoyed entering the herds competition, which Craigtown won in 2000, 2012, 2013 and 2016. A memorable occasion for Ronnie was when he was honoured with a Lifetime Achievement award by the Ayrshire Cattle Society at the 2014 conference in Cornwall. However, Ronnie suffered a series of injuries through

managing his Ayrshires. It was a culmination of these and rheumatoid arthritis that ultimately curtailed Ronnie's physical abilities. But the passion for herd continued to burn and his interest never subsided.



Whilst able to do so, Ronnie and Elaine would still make some of the Ayrshire events and conferences because there was more to Ayrshires than purely cows. There were the members of the Ayrshire family, lifelong friends, and associates. There was something more, perhaps only a community like the farming community can truly understand. It is these bonds, the visits, the phone calls, the shared memories that bind together and give strength in days of adversity.



In his younger days, Ronnie loved to run out Aghadowey to see the stock car racing with his friends and there were also longer runs following the car rallying.

Ronnie had close ties with Portrush Presbyterian church, where he attended the local boys brigade. First in Portrush, where his late uncle was an

officer. He attended church when he could and helped with the produce for the annual harvest service.

Finally, Ronnie just loved people. He was sincere, helpful, hardworking, and dependable. If anger came, it went again just as quickly and Ronnie was never one to fester on things or hold grudges, even through tough times when asked how he was, he would always say "I'm good".

Ronnie is survived by his beloved wife, Elaine, who is carrying on the farming tradition at Craigtown. He will be greatly missed by all the family circle, and friends.

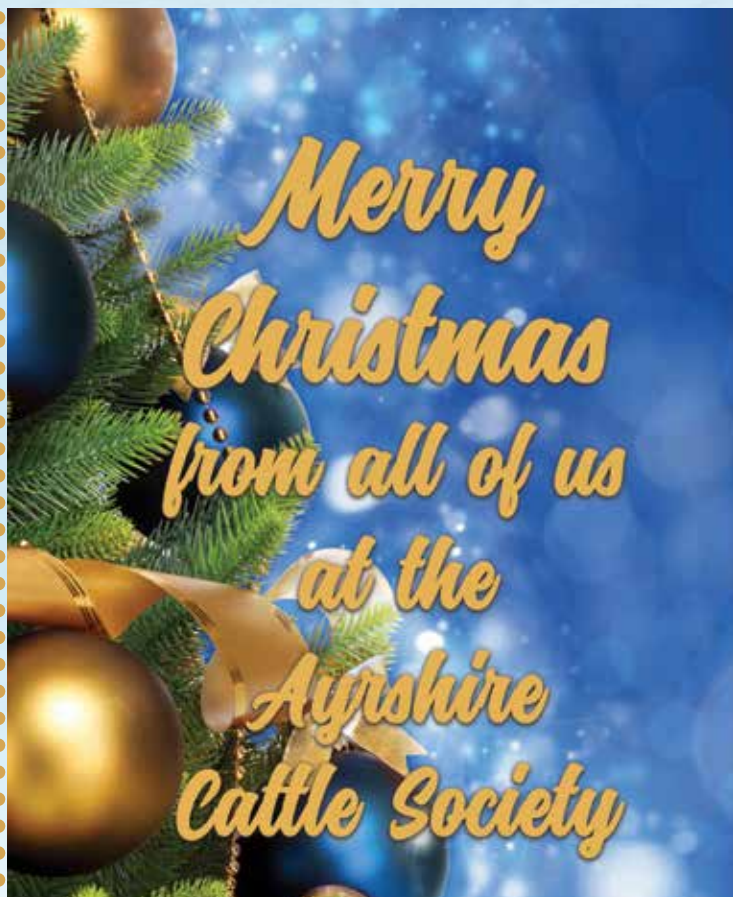
